ORDER

By the Chief, Competitive Pricing Division, Common Carrier Bureau:

1. On February 27, 2001 the former Bell Atlantic Telephone Companies¹ now doing business as Verizon Communications ("Verizon") filed Transmittal No. 1369.² Transmittal No. 1369 revises Tariff F.C.C. 1 to establish rates for cross-connects to LAN Extension Service by cross-referencing to the existing rate elements; and revises Tariff F.C.C. No. 11, in part, to introduce two new collocation office channel terminations for LAN Extension Service.

2. That portion of Transmittal No. 1369 which pertains to collocation raises the same issues regarding rate levels, rate structures, and terms and conditions of collocation services as those that are

currently subject to investigation in Bell Atlantic's Tariff F.C.C. Nos. 1 and 11, Access Service, expanded interconnection service offering.³ Therefore, those portions of Transmittal No. 1369 which pertain to collocation are suspended for one day and will be subject to the ongoing investigations.

3. Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that pursuant to Section 204(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 204(a), and the authority delegated pursuant to Section 0.91 and 0.291 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 0.091, 0.291, the revisions to Bell Atlantic's Tariff F.C.C. Nos. 1 and 11 pertaining to collocation, filed under Transmittal No. 1369, ARE SUSPENDED for one day from the effective date and an investigation of the referenced transmittal is instituted and incorporated within CC Docket Nos. 98-240, 96-165 and 94-97.

4. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that VERIZON SHALL FILE tariff revisions within five business days of the release date of this Order to reflect this suspension.

5. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, pursuant to Sections 4(I) and 204(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. §§ 154(I) and 204(a), VERIZON shall keep accurate account of all amounts received by reason of the rates that are subject to these investigations.
