Scout Day Sessions

Using these descriptions, rank the activities on your registration form in the order that you would like to participate.

Woodworking for Wildlife

This limited hands-on session will allow scouts the opportunity to build and take home a bird house. Participants will get exposure to working with wood and tools and an opportunity to learn about bird habitats. This session will fill up fast! **Limited to eight participants per session and scouts must be in 3rd grade or higher to participate.**

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: Scouts who have already participated in this session in past Scout Days are strongly encouraged <u>not</u> to sign-up again this year, as there are limited spots open.

Binocular and Scope Basics

Binoculars and spotting scopes can be extremely useful for finding and identifying wildlife but they can be tricky to use properly. This session will cover the basics of binocular and scope use and give scouts a chance to sharpen their newly acquired skills with a variety of games.

Junior Firefighter

If you've ever wondered what wildland firefighters do in the woods then this is the session for you. Join members of Seney's fire staff as they lead you through stations such as physical fitness, fire resistant clothing, fire tools, radio communication, weather readings, a short obstacle course and finally a tour of the fire engine where you'll get a chance to spray the fire hose! **This is a physically active session and is limited to 15 scouts per session.**

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: This session may be canceled at last minute if the fire staff is detailed to assist with wildfire operations. BCS – Requirement 5c & 15c; WEB – Forester 9.

Sensory Hike

Discover your senses while hiking a portion of the Pine Ridge Nature Trail. Can you spot the camouflaged items? Guess what you're touching in the "feely" bags. Identify each unique scent. Just don't inhale too deeply; they may not be pleasant orders! Discover why animals hear so well in the woods. The hike is about ½ mile long on mostly level ground. TCS – Requirement 5g, Elective 31; WCS – Requirement 10c; BCS – Requirement 12b; BGS – Outdoor Adventure 3 and 5, Ready Set Go Camping 6, Senses 1 & 4; JGS – Camp Together 8, Your Outdoor Surroundings 9.



Learn to Return

What would you do if you found yourself lost in the woods? What if you were hurt or in trouble and help was far away? This session will cover some basic survival first aid to keep you safe in an outdoor emergency. You will also make your own survival kit to keep with you on outdoor adventures. After all, being prepared is the duty of all scouts!

Archery

Step right up and take your best shot. This session will give scouts a chance to hone their skills regardless if they're a novice or an expert archer. Learn to shoot like the pros after a discussion on safety and equipment. **Limited to 12 scouts per session.**

Bird Banding

Birds wear jewelry too! Biologists put metal and plastic bands on bird legs to track their movements and identify individuals. This session will describe what bird banding is all about and give participants the opportunity to go through an actual bird banding simulation.

Something is Fishy

Scouts of all ages will enjoy this fun filled 1½ hour session. There will be an opportunity to learn the proper way to attach a hook to fishing line, bait a hook so your worm won't fly off, practice casting and most importantly get out and test your luck against the fish of Seney Refuge! **Due to its length, this session will only be offered twice. Limited to 14 participants per session. If selected, scouts may bring their own fishing gear or use ours.** *TCS – Fishing Belt Loop; WCS – Elective 19 a-f, Fishing Belt Loop; BCS – Requirement 23c, Fishing Belt Loop; WEB – Fishing Belt Loop; JGS – Environmental Health 10, Sports Sampler 4.*



Orienteering

What would you do if you were in the middle of the woods and the batteries died in your GPS? Would you know how to get back to your starting point? In this session scouts will have a chance to learn the parts of a compass, pacing, field bearings and compass readings. Then test your new skills in an orienteering treasure hunt! **Limited** to 12 participants per session.

Visitor Center Extravaganza

The visitor center can be an exciting place to learn about a variety of topics. This session is for those who would like to explore the center in a relaxed and enjoyable manner. Activities will include an owl pellet dissection table, a chance to identify trees using a key, age trees using tree cookies, make leaf rubbings, participate in a visitor center scavenger hunt and match animals to their tracks and scat.

Friendly Flames

Campfires are crucial to camping ambiance but can be difficult to start and maintain during inclement weather. This session will provide techniques for building different fire lays and outdoor fire safety tips.

WEB – Outdoor Requirement 7; JGS – Outdoor Cook 4, Outdoor Fun 4.

Energy Olympics

Saving energy helps your family and also helps conserve our natural resources. This active session gives the opportunity to discover ways to conserve electricity and water in your own home, learn about alternative energy sources and participate in a solar car race!

TCS – Elective 34; WCS – Requirement 7f; BCS – Requirement 6e, Elective 7c; WEB – Family Member Requirement 7; BGS – Water Everywhere 2 & 3; JGS – Environmental Health 3, Eco Action 1, Water Fun 7.

Interesting Insect Identities

We all know about them but perhaps they don't get as much love and attention as they deserve ... insects that is. Insects are responsible for pollinating many of the foods we eat everyday. Even though we call them pesky, annoying and aggravating, without them, flowers would not be pollinated, fruit and vegetables would not be harvested and many species of wildlife would be without food. This session will take a closer look at the insect world by focusing on their anatomy and then venture into the grass and water in search of our new found friends. TCS – Elective 31; WEB – Naturalist Requirement 2 & 11; JGS – Water Fun 8, Water Wonders 4 & 5.



Recycling Rubbish Right

Americans generate a tremendous amount of garbage each year. Unfortunately, most of us don't know where it goes once it leaves our homes. Reduce, reuse and recycle is one key to curbing our waste issues. This session will investigate waste management, provide tips to limit the amount of waste we generate and explore the topic through a unique art project.

TCS – Electives 33 & 47; WCS – Requirement 7b & c; BCS – Elective 9a, Requirement 6c; WEB – Artist Requirement 9; BGS – Earth is Our Home 2; JGS – Eco-Action 6, Discovering Technology 8, Outdoor Fun 6, Making Hobbies 5.



Astronomy

Since Earth is zipping through space at an incredible rate of speed, the night sky is constantly changing. While it isn't easy to study things that are *billions* of miles away, this session will tackle the "tip of the galaxy" with activities on figuring out the moon phases, using star clocks to find four constellations and inventing a constellation.

TCS & WCS – Astronomy Belt Loop; BCS – Elective 1a, b & f; WEB – Astronomy Belt Loop; BGS – Earth and Sky 7; JGS – Sky Search 1-4 & 7.

Tied up in Knots

Discover the world of knots! Learn to tie overhand, square, bowline, sheepshank, half-hitch and clove-hitch knots – maybe a few more if you're are not all tied up! **Limited to twelve participants per session.**

WCS - Elective 17a &e; BCS - Achievement 22; WEB - Outdoorsman 11; BGS - Ready Set Go Camping 5; JGS - Outdoor Fun 8, Yarn and Fabric 4.

Outdoor Cooking

Cooking outside can be a fun and healthy way to get in touch with nature. This session will teach the skills needed to safely and deliciously cook on coals, a portable camp stove, a hibachi and with pudgy pie makers. Participants will have a chance to taste their creations.

TCS – Elective 25; WCS – Achievement 8e; BCS – Achievement 9b, c, e & g; WEB – Outdoorsman 8, Family Member 11, JGS – Camp Together 5, Outdoor Cook 1, 3 & 5.
