A BILL

To amend the National Trails System Act to designate the New England National Scenic Trail, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "New England National
3 Scenic Trail Designation Act".

4 SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION AND ADMINISTRATION.

5 Section 5(a) of the National Trails System Act (16
6 U.S.C. 1244(a)) is amended by adding at the end the fol7 lowing:

8 "(NEW ENGLAND NATIONAL **SCENIC** 9 TRAIL.—The New England National Scenic Trail, a 10 continuous trail extending approximately 220 miles 11 from the border of New Hampshire in the town of 12 Royalston, Massachusetts to Long Island Sound in 13 the town of Guilford, Connecticut, as generally de-14 picted on the map titled 'New England National Sce-15 nic Trail Proposed Route', numbered T06-80,000, 16 and dated October 2007. The map shall be on file and 17 available for public inspection in the appropriate of-18 fices of the National Park Service. The Secretary of 19 the Interior, in cooperation with Federal, State, trib-20 al, regional, and local agencies, the Appalachian 21 Mountain Club, the Connecticut Forest and Park As-22 sociation, and other organizations, shall administer 23 the trail consistent with the recommendations of the 24 draft report titled the 'Metacomet Monadnock 25 Mattabesset Trail System National Scenic Trail Fea-26 sibility Study and Environmental Assessment', pre-•HR 1528 RH

pared by the National Park Service, and dated
 Spring 2006. The United States shall not acquire for
 the trail any land or interest in land without the con sent of the owner.".

5 SEC. 3. MANAGEMENT.

6 The Secretary of the Interior (hereafter in this Act re-7 ferred to as the "Secretary") shall use the Trail Manage-8 ment Blueprint described in the draft report titled the 9 "Metacomet Monadnock Mattabesett Trail System National 10 Scenic Trail Feasibility Study and Environmental Assessment", prepared by the National Park Service, and dated 11 Spring 2006, as the framework for management and ad-12 13 ministration of the New England National Scenic Trail. Additional or more detailed plans for administration, man-14 15 agement, protection, access, maintenance, or development of the trail may be developed consistent with the Trail Man-16 agement Blueprint, and as approved by the Secretary. 17

18 SEC. 4. COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS.

19 The Secretary is authorized to enter into cooperative 20 agreements with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts (and 21 its political subdivisions), the State of Connecticut (and its 22 political subdivisions), the Appalachian Mountain Club, the 23 Connecticut Forest and Park Association, and other re-24 gional, local, and private organizations deemed necessary 25 and desirable to accomplish cooperative trail administrative, management, and protection objectives consistent with
 the Trail Management Blueprint. An agreement under this
 section may include provisions for limited financial assist ance to encourage participation in the planning, acquisi tion, protection, operation, development, or maintenance of
 the trail.

7 SEC. 5. ADDITIONAL TRAIL SEGMENTS.

8 Pursuant to section 6 of the National Trails System 9 Act, the Secretary is encouraged to work with the State of New Hampshire and appropriate local and private organi-10 zations to include that portion of the Metacomet-Monadnock 11 12 Trail in New Hampshire (which lies between Royalston, Massachusetts and Jaffrey, New Hampshire) as a compo-13 nent of the New England National Scenic Trail. Inclusion 14 15 of this segment, as well as other potential side or connecting trails, is contingent upon written application to the Sec-16 retary by appropriate State and local jurisdictions and a 17 finding by the Secretary that trail management and ad-18 19 ministration is consistent with the Trail Management Blue-20 print.

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
