#### ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

#### NYSE ACTION AGAINST WALLACE E. LIN AFFIRMED

The Commission has affirmed disciplinary action taken by the New York Stock Exchange against Wallace E. Lin, of Sunnyvale, California, a former registered representative of an Exchange member firm. The Exchange fined Lin \$10,000, and barred him for four years from membership, allied membership, approved person status, and employment or association. In any capacity with a member or member organization.

The Commission found, as had the Exchange, that Lin effected unauthorized transactions in a joint customer account, attempted to conceal those transactions, improperly offered to reimburse the customers for their losses, made misrepresentations to the customers, and refused to comply with written Exchange inquiries about this matter and to testify in the Exchange's investigation. In affirming the sanctions imposed by the Exchange, the Commission stated that "[b]oth the investing public and the brokerage community must be protected from those who abuse the trust and confidence placed in them and impede the investigation of their misconduct." (Rel. 34-27666)

# ROBERT G. LEIGH CENSURED

The Commission has censured Robert G. Leigh, a Salt Lake City brokerage firm salesman. The Commission found that, in July 1984, Leigh unlawfully sold 26,000 shares of unregistered stock of Dynapac, Inc. for a customer who was a statutory underwriter. The Commission stated that a broker cannot merely act as an order taker, but must make whatever inquiries are necessary under the circumstances to determine that a sale for a customer is not part of an unlawful distribution. Leigh failed to make an adequate inquiry although there were obvious "red flags" in connection with his customer's sale. However, the Commission determined that censure was an appropriate sanction in light of Leigh's inexperience at the time and the fact that he made some effort to ascertain whether his customer was unlawfully selling unregistered stock. ## TRADING SUSPENSIONS

## CROWN COMPANIES GROUP, LTD. SECURITIES SUSPENDED

The Commission announced the single ten-day suspension of over-the-counter trading in the securities of The Crown Companies Group, Ltd. (formerly The Crown Gold Com-

Companies Group Ltd.) for the period beginning at 9:30 a.m. (EST) on February 9, 1990, and terminating at 11:59 p.m. (EST) on February 18, 1990. The Commission suspended trading in the securities of The Crown Companies Group, Ltd in view of questions that have been raised about the adequacy and accuracy of publicly disseminated information concerning, among other things, the identity of controlling persons and the company's business, operations, and financial condition. #### CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

# INTERNATIONAL MEDICAL MARKETING, JOSEPH R. EDINGTON PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Seattle Regional Office announced that Judge Robert J. McNichols, U.S. District Court Judge in Spokane, Washington permanently enjoined Joseph R. Edington on January 17, 1990, and International Medical Marketing, Inc. (IMM) on December 11, 1989.

The injunction against Edington prohibits him from future violations of Sections 5(a), 5(c), and 17(a) of the Securities Act, Sections 10(b) and 15(a) of the Securities Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 for unregistered sales of securities, fraud in the sales and operating as an unregistered broker-dealer. Edington was also ordered to disgorge \$765,592; however, disgorgement was waived based on Edington's demonstrated inability to pay.

The injunction against IMM prohibits the company from future violations of Sections 5(a), 5(c), and 17(a) of the Securities Act and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 for unregistered sales of securities and fraud in the sales.

Both defendants consented to the injunctions without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's Complaint. (SEC v. Joseph R. Edington, Howard Wilkins, International Medical Marketing, Inc., Image Productions, Inc., et al., Civil Action No. C88-511-RJM, ED WA filed September 28, 1988) (LR-12374)

# GENESIS CAPITAL CORPORATION PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Commission announced that, on January 31, U.S. District Judge Robert Potter, Western District of North Carolina, Charlotte Division, entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Relief by default against Genesis Capital Corporation, a registered investment company located in Charlotte, North Carolina. The Final Judgment permanently enjoins Genesis from violating certain provisions of the Investment Company Act and related rules, including registration statement filing, recordkeeping, custodial, fidelity bond, written code of ethics and reporting provisions. It further appoints F. Daniel Bell III, a Raleigh, North Carolina attorney as receiver for Genesis. The Complaint was filed on October 18, 1989. (SEC v. John V. Homes, et al., USDC WDNC, Charlotte Div., Civil Action No. C-C-89-0408-P) (LR-12375)

#### INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

#### AMERICAN UNITED LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

An order has been issued exempting American United Life Insurance Company and AUL American Unit Trust (the Account) from Sections 26(a)(2)(C) and 27(c)(2) of the Investment Company Act to the extent necessary to permit the deduction of a mortality and expense risk charge from the assets of the Account pursuant to certain group variable annuity contracts. (Rel. IC-17334 - Feb. 7)

## THE TRAVELERS INSURANCE COMPANY

An order has been issued exempting The Travelers Insurance Company (The Travelers), the Travelers Timed Growth Stock Account for Variable Annuities, The Travelers Timed Money Market Account for Variable Annuities, The Travelers Timed Bond Account for Variable Annuities (collectively, the Time Accounts), Travelers Equities Sales, Inc. (TESI), and H.C. Copeland Financial Services, Inc. (Copeland) (TESI and Copeland together, the "Timers") from the provisions of Sections 26(a)(2) and 27(c)(2) of the Investment Company Act in connection with their proposed method of deducting fees for certain market timing services provided by the Timers or certain other unaffiliated market timers, and under Section 17(d) of the Act and Rule 17d-1 to the extent necessary to permit the Timed Accounts to enter into agreements with The Travelers which will provide that The Travelers will deduct market timing fees from the Timed Accounts which are, in turn, paid by The Travelers to the Timers. (Rel. IC-17335 - Feb. 7)

#### HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

#### CONSOLIDATED NATURAL GAS COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Consolidated Natural Gas Company to issue and sell, through December 31, 1990, up to four million shares of its authorized but unissued common stock (\$2.75 par) under an exception from competitive bidding. (Rel. 35-25034)
