AMENDING SECTION 15-502, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS; RELATING TO SCHOOL TEACHERS.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona: Section 1. Section 15-502, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

15-502. Employment of school district personnel: payment of wages of discharged employee

- A. The governing board may at any time employ and fix the salaries and benefits of employees necessary for the succeeding year. The contracts of all certificated employees shall be in writing, and all employees shall be employed subject to the provisions of section 38-481. The governing board may obtain the services of any employee, including teachers, substitute teachers and administrators, by contracting with a private entity that employs personnel required by the school district.
- B. A teacher shall not be employed if the teacher has not received a certificate for teaching granted by the proper authorities. If a teacher has filed an application and completed all of the requirements for a certificate but time does not allow a teacher to receive a certificate before the commencement of employment, the conditional certificate shall serve as a certificate for the payment of wages, provided that the teacher files the conditional certificate with the county school superintendent and the certificate is issued within three months of the date of commencing employment. In order to be paid wages beyond the three month period prescribed in this subsection, the teacher shall file the certificate with the county school superintendent. Any contract issued to a teacher who has completed certificate requirements but has not received a certificate shall be specifically contingent upon receipt of such a certificate. The governing board of a school district that is subject to section 15-914.01 shall adhere to the duties described in section 15-302, subsection A, paragraph 9 for purposes of this subsection.
- C. No dependent, as defined in section 43-1001, of a governing board member may be employed in the school district in which the person to whom such dependent is so related is a governing board member, except by consent of the board.
- D. The governing board may employ certificated teachers under contract as part-time classroom teachers. Notwithstanding any other statute, a certificated teacher who has been employed by the school district for more than the major portion of three consecutive school years does not lose the entitlement to the procedures prescribed in sections 15-538.01, 15-539 through 15-544 and 15-547 if the teacher is employed under contract on a part-time basis for at least forty per cent time. As used in FOR THE PURPOSES OF this subsection, "forty per cent time" means employed for at least forty per cent of full-time teachers of the same grade level or for at least forty per cent of the class load assigned to full-time teachers of the same grade level, as determined by the governing board.

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- E. Notwithstanding sections 23-351 and 23-353, if an employee is discharged from the service of a school district, the school district shall pay the wages due to the employee within ten calendar days from the date of discharge.
- F. Each school district shall establish policies and procedures to provide teachers with personal liability insurance.
- G. THE MINIMUM SALARY FOR A FULL-TIME TEACHER EMPLOYED BY A SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL BE THIRTY-THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS PER YEAR.
- H. BEGINNING IN 2007, ON OR BEFORE NOVEMBER 15 OF EACH YEAR, EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL REPORT TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION THE NUMBER OF TEACHERS THAT WILL BE EMPLOYED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT, THE BASE PAY OF EACH TEACHER AND THE REMAINING NUMBER OF TEACHERS NEEDED BY CONTENT AREA AND GRADE LEVEL. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SUBSECTION, "BASE PAY" MEANS THE BASE SALARY OF A TEACHER PLUS MONIES DISTRIBUTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 15-977 AND ANY ADDITIONAL CONTRACTUAL TEACHER COMPENSATION MONIES. BASE PAY DOES NOT INCLUDE PERFORMANCE PAY.

Sec. 2. Statewide teacher development and recognition plan

- A. The state board of education shall adopt a statewide teacher development and recognition plan. The board shall recommend to the governor and to the legislature an integrated teacher quality, support and assessment program that, at a minimum, does the following:
- 1. Provides for the improvement of instruction and teacher pay using student achievement data and goals.
- 2. Includes standards-based teacher professional development opportunities.
- 3. Recognizes both base pay increases and one-time performance stipends for individuals, teams and schools based on increasing levels of student achievement and teacher responsibility.
- 4. Recognizes professional development growth based on professional development standards and mentoring and coaching duties.
- 5. Allows school districts to work in cooperation with the appropriate departments of the counties in which the school districts are located to implement the integrated program or to form multidistrict partnerships to support the professional development and evaluation components of the program.
- 6. Uses the principles of the master teacher definition developed by the state board of education to define an Arizona master teacher for the integrated program. This definition shall include consideration of a teacher's years of service, the ability to assist students at various levels of achievement to make academic progress and a clear understanding of how to use data and professional development to further impact student learning and achievement.
- B. Participation in this integrated program shall be required of districts, except that teachers may choose not to participate in integrated performance programs that involve additional responsibilities outside of

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their classroom responsibilities, such as mentoring, coaching and participation on school and district committees. The goal of the plan is to consolidate teacher quality and pay programs into a single program that supports, expects and encourages student achievement and teacher development and retention and to reduce duplicative administrative burdens on schools and teachers.

- C. The state board of education shall consider the recommendations of the state career ladder advisory committee established by section 15-918.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, and the Arizona performance based compensation system task force established by section 15-920.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, in developing the integrated program.
- D. The state board of education shall adopt recommendations for an integrated program on or before November 15, 2007, including a process for review and approval of district plans to comply with the adopted integrated program requirements. The plan, including any recommendations regarding the funding mechanism and base level increases for the integrated performance programs, shall consider the resources and expertise of the state career ladder advisory committee, the Arizona performance based compensation system task force and the management duties of the department of education.
- E. The state board of education shall eliminate unnecessary and cumbersome regulation and reporting requirements that would otherwise interfere with the efficient administration of the integrated program.

Sec. 3. Appropriation; program development

- A. The sum of \$3,000,000 is appropriated from the state general fund in fiscal year 2007-2008 to the state board of education for program development and review and for allocation of planning grants to school districts requesting assistance in developing a plan to meet the professional development and evaluation requirements of the teacher development and recognition plan prescribed in section 2 of this act.
- B. The grants from monies appropriated pursuant to subsection A shall be distributed to school districts that demonstrate a need for planning. The grants may also be distributed to consortiums of school districts and regional education agencies to collaborate and plan on a regional basis. No more than ten per cent of the monies distributed may be used for administrative purposes.
- C. The state board of education may use a portion of the monies appropriated pursuant to subsection A to fill two new full-time equivalent positions to provide ongoing guidance to the state board of education on the need for teacher development and support related to new education mandates, rules or programs or changes to education mandates, rules or programs and the status of standards-based professional development in schools and school districts in this state.

Sec. 4. Appropriation; mentor training

The sum of \$4,000,000 is appropriated from the state general fund in fiscal year 2007-2008 to the state board of education for distribution to the

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Arizona K-12 center to provide regional support for program implementation and mentor training for the Arizona master teacher program as prescribed by the state board of education.

Sec. 5. Appropriation: training grants

- A. The sum of \$700,000 is appropriated from the state general fund in fiscal year 2007-2008 to the state board of education for distribution to the Arizona K-12 center to enhance professional development based on standards and to expand teacher capacity to integrate technology into the classroom.
- B. The state board of education may use the monies appropriated pursuant to subsection A to issue training grants to educational service agencies with a plan to provide training that develops regional and local capacity for using the standards. The education service agencies shall focus training on schools and school districts that demonstrate the most need.

Sec. 6. Appropriation; teacher salaries; exemption

- A. The sum of \$50,000,000 is appropriated from the state general fund in fiscal year 2007-2008 to the state board of education to increase the school district base support level to _____ per cent in order to carry out the purposes of section 15-502, subsection G, Arizona Revised Statutes, as amended by this act.
- B. School districts shall use any remaining monies distributed from the monies appropriated pursuant to subsection A of this section to increase the teacher base pay for teachers whose salaries already meet or exceed \$33,000 per year. These monies shall supplement and not supplant any compensation increases previously negotiated and shall be in addition to other raises that are customarily provided to teachers from school district discretionary monies, including inflationary increases as mandated by law or that result from student growth and teacher compensation increases pursuant to section 15-977, Arizona Revised Statutes.
- C. The appropriation made in subsection A of this section is exempt from the provisions of section 35-190, Arizona Revised Statutes, relating to lapsing of appropriations.

Sec. 7. Appropriation; math and science teachers; exemption

- A. The sum of \$10,000,000 is appropriated from the state general fund in fiscal year 2007-2008 to the state board of education to increase the base support level by ____ per cent for distribution to school districts for payments to highly qualified mathematics and science teachers in teacher shortage and retention areas as determined by the state board of education.
- B. The monies appropriated pursuant to subsection A of this section shall be allocated to school districts based on the number of certified mathematics and science teachers in each school district and shall be distributed to mathematics and science teachers in a manner deemed appropriate by each school district governing board.
- C. The appropriation made in subsection A of this section is exempt from the provisions of section 35–190, Arizona Revised Statutes, relating to lapsing of appropriations.

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Sec. 8. Appropriation: technology infrastructure mapping: exemption

- A. The sum of \$300,000 is appropriated from the state general fund in fiscal year 2007-2008 to the government information technology agency to map technology infrastructure in school districts to assist in the determination of the expansion of technology to teaching and to learning in twenty-first century classrooms in this state.
- B. The appropriation made in subsection A of this section is exempt from the provisions of section 35-190, Arizona Revised Statutes, relating to lapsing of appropriations.

Sec. 9. Appropriation; incentives to increase the supply of mathematics and science teachers; exemption

- A. The sum of \$3,000,000 is appropriated from the state general fund in fiscal year 2007-2008 to the Arizona board of regents for targeted incentives to increase the supply of mathematics and science teachers.
- B. The monies appropriated pursuant to subsection A of this section shall be distributed by the Arizona board of regents as follows:
 - 1. Northern Arizona university, \$1,500,000.
 - 2. Arizona state university, \$750,000.
 - 3. The university of Arizona, \$750,000.
- C. The monies appropriated pursuant to subsection A of this section shall be used for the following purposes:
- 1. To bring middle school pupils, junior high pupils and high school pupils to university campuses for summer programs in an effort to promote mathematics and science.
- 2. To create a scholarship program to help steer university students toward mathematics and science programs. Under this scholarship program, students who receive scholarships shall repay this state through service to public schools in this state after graduating from college and obtaining teacher certification.
- 3. Retraining teachers for mathematics and science through a scholarship program similar to the scholarship program prescribed in paragraph 2 of this subsection. Financial assistance shall be provided to existing certificated teachers who do not currently meet the highly qualified criteria in mathematics and science, but who wish to add one or both of these subject areas to their areas of teaching expertise.
- D. The appropriation made in subsection A of this section is exempt from the provisions of section 35-190, Arizona Revised Statutes, relating to lapsing of appropriations.

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
