# A BILL

To implement the recommendations of the Guam War Claims Review Commission.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; TABLE OF CONTENTS.

2 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the

#### 3 "Guam World War II Loyalty Recognition Act".

#### 6 SEC. 2. PURPOSES.

7 The purposes of this Act are to—

8 (1) acknowledge the suffering of the residents 9 of Guam as a result of the occupation of Guam in 10 World War II by Imperial Japanese military forces; 11 (2) acknowledge the steadfast loyalty to the 12 United States of the residents of Guam as a result 13 of the occupation of Guam in World War II by Im-14 perial Japanese military forces;

(3) compensate surviving relatives for the
deaths of residents of Guam as a result of the occupation of Guam in World War II by Imperial Japanese military forces;

(4) compensate persons who themselves suf-fered personal injury (including rape and malnutri-

tion), forced labor, forced march, or internment as
 a result of the occupation of Guam in World War II
 by Imperial Japanese military forces; and

4 (5) establish a trust fund to sponsor research
5 and educational activities regarding the wartime oc6 cupation and liberation of Guam, scholarships, med7 ical facilities, and other benefits for the people of
8 Guam.

# 9 SEC. 3. RECOGNITION OF THE SUFFERING AND LOYALTY 10 OF THE RESIDENTS OF GUAM.

11 (a) Recognition of the Suffering of the Resi-12 DENTS OF GUAM.—The United States of America recog-13 nizes that, as described by the Guam War Claims Review Commission, the residents of Guam, on account of their 14 15 United States nationality, suffered unspeakable harm as a result of the occupation of Guam by Imperial Japanese 16 military forces during World War II, by being subjected 17 18 to death, personal injury (including rape and malnutrition), forced labor, forced march, or internment. 19

(b) RECOGNITION OF THE LOYALTY OF THE RESIDENTS OF GUAM.—The United States of America forever
will be grateful to the residents of Guam for their steadfast loyalty to the United States of America, as demonstrated by the countless acts of courage they performed
despite the threat of death or great bodily harm they faced

1	at the hands of the Imperial Japanese military forces that
2	occupied Guam during World War II.
3	SEC. 4. DEFINITIONS.
4	In this Act—
5	(1) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
6	the Secretary of the Interior.
7	(2) Commission.—The term "Commission"
8	means the Guam World War II Loyalty Recognition
9	Commission established under section $8(a)(1)$ .
10	(3) FUND.—The term "Fund" means the
11	Guam World War II Loyalty Recognition Fund es-
12	tablished under section 5(a).
13	(4) TRUST FUND.—The term "Trust Fund"
14	means the Guam World War II Remembrance Trust
15	Fund established under section 9(a).
16	(5) ELIGIBLE SURVIVOR.—The term "eligible
17	survivor''—
18	(A) as used in section 6, means the spouse,
19	child, or parent, respectively in this order of
20	priority, who is identified as an eligible suc-
21	cessor claimant in section 5(d) of title I of the
22	War Claims Act of 1948 (50 U.S.C. App.
23	2004(d)); and

1	(B) as used in section 7, means the
2	spouse, child, or parent, respectively in this
3	order of priority—
4	(i) who is identified as an eligible suc-
5	cessor claimant in section 5(d) of title I of
6	the War Claims Act of 1948 (50 U.S.C.
7	App. 2004(d)); and
8	(ii) who is living in the year 1990.
9	SEC. 5. GUAM WORLD WAR II LOYALTY RECOGNITION
10	FUND.
11	(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There shall be established in
12	the Treasury of the United States the Guam World War
13	II Loyalty Recognition Fund.
14	(b) REPORTS.—The Secretary shall report to Con-
15	gress, not later than 60 days after the end of each fiscal

1 ments from the Fund, as authorized by this Act, whichever
2 occurs later. On the date the Fund is terminated, all in3 vestments of amounts in the Fund shall be liquidated by
4 the Secretary and the proceeds thereof deposited in the
5 Fund, and all moneys remaining in the Fund shall be de6 posited in the miscellaneous receipts account in the Treas7 ury.

#### 8 SEC. 6. PAYMENTS FOR DEATH.

9 The Secretary shall, subject to the availability of 10 funds appropriated for the Fund and after receipt of certification pursuant to section 8(b)(7), pay the sum of 11 12 \$25,000 for distribution to the eligible survivor or among 13 the eligible survivors of each resident of Guam who died or was killed as a result of the attack and occupation of 14 15 Guam by Imperial Japanese military forces during World War II, or incident to the liberation of Guam by United 16 17 States military forces, and whose death would have been 18 compensable under the Guam Meritorious Claims Act of 19 1945 (Public Law 79–224) and the implementing regulations issued by the United States Navy pursuant thereto. 2021 SEC. 7. PAYMENTS FOR PERSONAL INJURY, FORCED 22 LABOR, FORCED MARCH, AND INTERNMENT.

The Secretary of the Interior shall, subject to the
availability of funds appropriated for the Fund and after
receipt of certification pursuant to section 8(b)(7), pay the

sum of \$12,000 to each person, or to the eligible survivor
 or among the eligible survivors of such person, who suf fered, as a result of the attack and occupation of Guam
 by Imperial Japanese military forces during World War
 II, or incident to the liberation of Guam by United States
 military forces, one or more of the following:

- 7 (1) Personal injury (including rape and mal-8 nutrition).
- 9 (2) Forced labor.
- 10 (3) Forced march.
- 11 (4) Internment.

12 (5) Hiding to evade internment.

### 13 SEC. 8. ADJUDICATION.

14 (a) GUAM WORLD WAR II LOYALTY RECOGNITION15 COMMISSION.—

(1) COMMISSION ESTABLISHED.—The Foreign
Claims Settlement Commission of the United States
in the United States Department of Justice shall establish a commission to be known as the "Guam
World War II Loyalty Recognition Commission" to
adjudicate claims and determine eligibility for award
payments pursuant to sections 6 and 7.

(2) MEMBERSHIP AND CHAIRMAN OF COMMISSION.—The Commission shall be composed of five
members, who shall be appointed by the chairman of

the Foreign Claims Settlement Commission, in consultation with the Secretary, with two members appointed after consideration of a list of ten nominees submitted by the Governor of Guam. The chairman of the Foreign Claims Settlement Commission shall designate one of the members of the Commission to serve as chairman of the Commission.

8 (3) TERMS OF CHAIRMAN AND MEMBERS.—The 9 chairman and members of the Commission shall 10 serve at the pleasure of the chairman of the Foreign 11 Claims Settlement Commission, with any vacancy in 12 the membership of the Commission to be filled in the 13 same manner as the original appointment.

14 (4) COMPENSATION.—The chairman and mem-15 bers of the Commission shall receive compensation 16 as provided under section 5316 of title 5, United 17 States Code, and shall receive reimbursement for 18 travel and other expenses incurred in connection 19 with their duties as members, or a per diem allow-20 ance in lieu thereof, at a level not to exceed that pre-21 scribed under the provisions of subchapter I of chap-22 ter 57 of title 5, United States Code.

23 (5) STAFF OF COMMISSION; STAFF, FACILITIES,
24 AND SERVICES OF FEDERAL AGENCIES.—

1	(A) STAFF OF COMMISSION.—The Com-
2	mission may, subject to the approval of the
3	chairman of the Foreign Claims Settlement
4	Commission, appoint and fix the compensation
5	and allowances of such officers, attorneys, and
6	employees as may be reasonably necessary for
7	its proper functioning, which employees shall be
8	in addition to those who may be assigned by the
9	chairman of the Foreign Claims Settlement
10	Commission to assist the Commission in car-
11	rying out its functions. The Commission may
12	also delegate functions to any member, officer,
13	or employee of the Commission. The compensa-
14	tion of officers, attorneys, and employees ap-
15	pointed pursuant to this subsection shall be set
16	in accordance with subchapter III of chapter 53
17	of title 5, United States Code, and they shall
18	receive reimbursement for travel and other ex-
19	penses incurred in connection with their duties,
20	or a per diem allowance in lieu thereof at a
21	level not to exceed the amount of allowances
22	prescribed under the provisions of subchapter I
23	of chapter 57 of title 5, United States Code.
24	(B) STAFF, FACILITIES, AND SERVICES OF

25 FEDERAL AGENCIES.—Officers and employees

1 of any other department or agency of the Gov-2 ernment of the United States or the Govern-3 ment of Guam may, with the consent of the 4 head of such department or agency, with or 5 without reimbursement, be assigned to assist 6 the Commission in carrying out its functions. 7 The Commission may, with the consent of the 8 head of any other department or agency of the 9 Government of the United States or the Gov-10 ernment of Guam, utilize, with or without reim-11 bursement, a facility or service of such depart-12 ment or agency in carrying out the functions of 13 the Commission.

14 (6) RULES AND REGULATIONS.—The Commis15 sion shall prescribe such rules and regulations as
16 may be necessary to enable it to carry out its func17 tions. Such rules and regulations shall be published
18 in the Federal Register.

19 (7) EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS PERMITTED.—
20 Subject to the general supervision of the chairman
21 of the Foreign Claims Settlement Commission, and
22 subject to the availability of the funds appropriated
23 for payment of the expenses of the Commission pur24 suant to section 10 of this Act, the Commission may

1 expend such funds as may be reasonably necessary 2 to enable it to carry out its functions. 3 (b) CLAIMS SUBMITTED FOR GUAM WORLD WAR II 4 LOYALTY RECOGNITION FUND.— 5 (1) FILING PERIOD FOR CLAIMS AND NOTICE. 6 All claims for a payment described under section 6 7 or 7 shall be filed within one year of the publishing 8 of public notice in the Federal Register. In addition, 9 public notice of the deadline for filing claims shall 10 be published in newspaper, radio, and television 11 media on Guam. 12 (2) ADJUDICATORY DECISIONS.—The decision 13 of the Commission on each claim shall be by major-14 ity vote, shall be in writing, and shall state the rea-

sons for the approval or denial of the claim. If approved, the decision shall also state the amount
awarded and the distribution, if any, to be made of
the award.

19 (3) DEDUCTIONS IN PAYMENT.—The Commis20 sion shall deduct, from potential awards, amounts
21 previously paid under the Guam Meritorious Claims
22 Act of 1945 (Public Law 79–224), if the previous
23 amounts were of \$1,000 or more in the case of
24 awards for death, or of \$500 or more in the case of
25 awards for personal injury.

(4) INTEREST.—No interest shall be paid on amounts awarded by the Commission.

(5) REMUNERATION PROHIBITED.—No remu-3 4 neration on account of representational services ren-5 dered on behalf of any claimant in connection with 6 any claim filed with the Commission under this Act 7 shall exceed one per centum of the total amount 8 paid pursuant to any award certified under the pro-9 visions of this Act on account of such claim. Any 10 agreement to the contrary shall be unlawful and 11 void. Whoever demands or receives, on account of 12 services so rendered, any remuneration in excess of 13 the maximum permitted by this section shall be 14 fined not more than \$5,000 or imprisoned not more 15 than twelve months, or both.

(6) APPEALS AND FINALITY.—Objections and
appeals of decisions of the Commission shall be to
the Commission, and upon rehearing, the decision in
each claim shall be final, and not subject to further
review by any court or agency.

(7) CERTIFICATION FOR PAYMENT.—After a
decision approving a claim becomes final, the chairman of the Commission shall certify it to the Secretary for authorization of an award payment described under section 6 or 7, as applicable.

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1 (8) Release of related claims.—Accept-2 ance of payment by an eligible individual shall be in 3 full satisfaction of all claims arising under the Guam 4 Meritorious Claims Act of 1945 (Public Law 79– 5 224), the implementing regulations issued by the 6 United States Navy pursuant thereto, and this Act. 7 SEC. 9. GUAM WORLD WAR II REMEMBRANCE TRUST FUND. 8 (a) Requirement to Establish Trust Fund.— 9 The Secretary shall establish a non-profit corporation in-10 corporated under the laws of Guam to be known as the 11 "Guam World War II Remembrance Trust Fund". 12 (b) PURPOSES OF TRUST FUND.—The Trust Fund 13 shall be used to— 14 (1) receive funds that result from the following 15 processes-16 (A) within 90 days after the filing period 17 described under section 8(b)(1), the Trust 18 Fund is subrogated to the rights before the 19 Commission of any person who, while eligible to 20 submit a claim for a payment described under 21 section 6 or 7, failed to file such a claim; 22 (B) the Trust Fund is subrogated to the 23 rights of any person to receive an award from 24 the Commission if that person states his or her

refusal in writing and files it with the Trust Fund; and

3 (C) the Trust Fund shall receive from the
4 United States Treasury the proceeds of each
5 check issued against the Fund that has not
6 been cashed after one year from the date of
7 issuance of such check;

8 (2) sponsor research, educational, and media 9 activities, so that the events surrounding the World 10 War II occupation of Guam by Imperial Japanese 11 military forces and liberation of Guam by United 12 States military forces, as well as the loyalty of the 13 people of Guam, will be remembered, and so that the 14 causes and circumstances of this and other wartime 15 events may be illuminated and understood;

16 (3) grant scholarships;

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(4) provide medical facilities to treat the medical and mental needs of residents of Guam who survived the World War II occupation of Guam by Imperial Japanese military forces; and

(5) undertake such other public projects, consistent with the foregoing, that would benefit the
people of Guam.

24 (c) BOARD OF DIRECTORS.—

1 (1)MEMBERSHIP AND APPOINTMENT.—The 2 board of directors of the corporation shall consist of 3 three persons appointed by the Secretary for stag-4 gered three-year terms from lists of up to five nomi-5 nees each that may be submitted by the Governor of 6 Guam, the Speaker of the Legislature of Guam, and 7 the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Guam. 8 All of the nominees shall be residents of Guam, and, 9 for the first 10 years of the life of the Trust Fund, 10 shall be persons who lived in Guam during the 11 World War II occupation of Guam by Imperial Jap-12 anese military forces.

13 (2) MEETINGS AND COMPENSATION.—The
14 board of directors shall meet one day every three
15 months to conduct Trust Fund business, with each
16 member being paid \$100 for each such meeting.

17 (d) EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR; SECRETARY-TREAS18 URER.—The Trust Fund may hire an Executive Director
19 and a Secretary-Treasurer of the Trust Fund.

(e) TERMINATION.—At any time later than two years
after the conclusion of all adjudications by the Commission, the Trust Fund shall terminate if the value of the
assets of the Trust Fund is less than \$250,000. The termination date of the Trust Fund shall be that date which
is three months after the date on which the value is less

than \$250,000. On the date the Trust Fund is terminated,
 all investments of amounts in the Trust Fund shall be liq uidated by the Secretary and the proceeds thereof depos ited in the miscellaneous receipts account in the Treasury.

## 5 SEC. 10. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

6 There are authorized to be appropriated such sums7 as may be necessary to pay amounts awarded under this8 Act and to pay the expenses of the Commission.

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
