Subject Index

SAVE TIME WITH THE SUBJECT INDEX

To find the most useful references and find them quickly, you may wish to answer these questions:

Should I use this index?

Yes, if you need references for a specific subject.

No, if you already know any titles you'll need. See the Title Index. (Also, each chapter starts with a list of titles.)

Maybe, if you need references for a geographic area. It depends on which area. (The total for the United States is included in most data products, as you will see in the abstracts.) This index does list a few extraordinary areas—foreign countries and "American Indian and Alaska Native areas," for example. So try here, but if you don't see the area, turn to the list on page 10 and the chart on pages 11-23, which specify the types of geographic areas (for example, metropolitan areas, counties, and places) reported in data products.

Other approaches? For economic census data, try "Geographic Area Series" in the Title Index. Also, the abstracts themselves highlight geographic areas covered. Moreover, charts on pages 193-198 in the chapter on the 1990 census list the geographic areas and subjects in 1990 data files and reports.

If you have a general (rather than a specific) subject in mind, after trying this index, see the Programs and Products chart on pages 11 ff.

Wherever else you check for subjects, you should, as a rule, find it helpful to return to this index for any additional references.

Which subject should I check?

Usually, check the most specific subject first. (For shipments of iron castings, for example, begin with "Iron: Castings," not more general terms like "shipments". Then, check under progressively broader terms, if necessary.

You usually will find the word or some synonym in the abstract.

Is the number given for an abstract or page?

The index mainly refers to abstract—not page—numbers. We italicize the page numbers and use a "p." or "pp." to distinguish them.

How can I go beyond the index to get the references I need?

Update the references you find. How? Check the section in each chapter entitled "Data Products Issued October-December 1994" for more recent references. (We do index that section but in less detail than for the abstracts in the chapters.) To keep up to date, get the complimentary Monthly Product Announcement (see abstract number 44). For a fee, it is possible to keep up virtually daily (see abstract 15.5). Online access is an option, too (see page 2). Finally, when you order a data product, first ask Customer Services, 301-457-4100, if a more recent version has been issued.

Find out more. Neither the abstracts nor the index can cite every subject covered in the data products. Nor can the Catalog/Guide—not even in the "Ordering Products" section—cover each detail in the ordering process. So, if in doubt about the ORDERING INFORMATION, call 301-457-4100. If in doubt about the CONTENT, you may want to consult the specialists listed under "Census Bureau—Washington," in appendix B.

Try other sources. If you need data that you don't find indexed here, try data centers, other Federal agencies, and additional reference sources in appendix B. It provides telephone numbers and addresses, and it describes key Federal data reports.

Tape-to-CD-ROM Conversion

The Data User Services Division (DUSD) maintains an extensive library of data files on computer tape, as produced by various divisions and others within the Census Bureau. Due to the sheer number of such data files, not all have had a CD-ROM counterpart produced for them and included in our "cataloged" CD-ROM sales inventory. To accommodate customers who want tape files on CD-ROM, DUSD offers the tape—to—CD-ROM conversion option described below. For additional information or to place orders, contact Customer Services (301-457-4100).

- 1. Any data file in our computer tape inventory can be transferred to a CD-ROM disc(s) on request.
- 2. The price charged for such a specially prepared CD-ROM is the same as that charged for the computer tape version. For example, to convert every STF 4B state file for all race iterations to the special CD-ROM format, the customer is charged the same as if he or she were purchasing these files on tape reels or cartridges. That charge is \$40,000. As another example, converting the 1991 Residential Finance Survey File from tape to CD-ROM costs \$175, the same as the price for the file on tape.
- We process orders within a span of three to four weeks. The time is needed because the CD-ROM's are prepared individually on demand. If we are swamped with orders, processing time is proportionately longer.
- 4. The data files on CD-ROM are in the same format as they are on tape, that is, they are straight ASCII copies. We do not offer file reformatting. Also, at this time, we are unable to provide an EBCDIC or dBase translation.
- The CD-ROM's are accompanied by a paper copy of the appropriate tape file technical documentation, as it describes the exact same file layouts and data properties.
- 6. The Bureau does not provide any sort of general access software or otherwise produce special application programs for these CD-ROM's. Customers are responsible for providing programming resources, just as they would be for computer tapes. The "GO" and "EXTRACT" software programs designed to be used with the "cataloged" CD-ROM's will not function with these data files.
- Finally, because the tape-to-CD-ROM conversion results in a special disc prepared at the customer's specific request, we do not make refunds.
