1	SECTION 1. REQUIREMENT OF STAFF WORKING WITH DE-
2	VELOPMENTALLY DISABLED PERSONS TO
3	CALL EMERGENCY SERVICES IN THE EVENT
4	OF A LIFE-THREATENING SITUATION.
5	(a) Requirement.—Section 1902(a) of the Social
6	Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1396a(a)) is amended—
7	(1) in paragraph (66), by striking "and" at the
8	end;
9	(2) in paragraph (67), by striking the period at
10	the end and inserting "; and; and
11	(3) by inserting after paragraph (67) the fol-
12	lowing new paragraph:
13	"(68) provide, in accordance with regulations of
14	the Secretary, that direct care staff providing
15	health-related services to a person with a develop-
16	mental disability or traumatic brain injury are re-
17	quired to call the 911 emergency telephone service
18	or equivalent emergency management service for as-
19	sistance in the event of a life-threatening emergency
20	to such person and to report such call to the appro-
21	priate State agency or department.".
22	(b) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
23	subsection (a) take effect on January 1, 2006.
