ELAINE CACHERIS NAMED ASSISTANT REGIONAL ADMINISTRATOR IN LOS ANGELES

Los Angeles Regional Administrator Irving M. Einhorn announced the appointment of Elaine M. Cacheris as Assistant Regional Administrator for Enforcement, effective October 9. Ms. Cacheris joined the Commission's staff in November 1984 as an enforcement attorney in the Fort Worth Regional Office and in January 1987 transferred to the Los Angeles Regional Office. In June 1987, she was appointed to the position of Special Counsel Enforcement and became a Branch Chief in Enforcement in January 1988. Ms. Cacheris received her B.A. in 1977 from the University of Arizona and her J.D. from McGeorge School of Law, University of the Pacific, in 1980. Before joining the Commission's staff, she was an Assistant Attorney General for the State of Texas.

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES WASHINGTON STATE BROKER-DEALER, OTHERS

The Seattle Regional Office filed a Complaint on September 28 in the Eastern District of Washington against Colonial International Import, Ltd., CDA Securities, Inc., a broker-dealer, Corporate Consultants Associated, Inc. (CCA), Steven K. Holding, Charles H. Koski, Bruce H. Frost, an attorney, Ronald W. Webb, and others alleging violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws through sham public distributions of securities, aided and abetted by Larry A. Dixon, an accountant. The Complaint also alleged that Holding, Koski, CCA, and Frost violated the Securities Exchange Act by failing to register as broker-dealers, and that CDA and its president, John R. Coghlan, charged excessive markups.

The Court entered permanent injunctions against CDA and Coghlan on September 30 and against Colonial and Webb on October 11 by their consent without them admitting or denying the Commission's allegations. [The securities authorities of the States of Washington and West Virginia assisted investigation in this case.] (SEC v. Colonial International Import, Ltd., et al., EDWA, Civil Action No. C-88-510-JLQ). (LR-11896)

TAIWO S. INMAN ENJOINED

The Philadelphia Regional Office announced that on October 18 U.S. District Judge Royce Lamberth, U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia, entered a permanent injunction against Taiwo S. Inman, enjoining him from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Inman consented to the Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's October 18 Complaint.

Among other things, the Commission found that Inman willfully violated the antifraud provisions when, during the time he was a registered representative but without knowledge of the firms, he made false and misleading statements of material fact which caused investors to purchase notes, investment contracts, and evidences of indebtedness of Financial Horizons Unlimited, Inc. (FHU), a defunct company of which he was the controlling person, and The Washington Flyer, a privately-owned magazine for commuters. In particular, Inman made misrepresentations and omissions of material fact to investors including the true nature of the investment, the return investors would receive, FHU's status as an on-going enterprise, and the use of investors' proceeds. FINANCIAL HORIZONS LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 8 to request a hearing on an application filed by Financial Horizons Life Insurance Company, Financial Horizons VA Separate Account-I, and Nationwide Financial Services, Inc. for an order granting exemptions from the provisions of Sections 26(a)(2)(C) and 27(C)(2) of the Investment Company Act to permit the deduction of a mortality and expense risk charge from the assets of Separate Account-I. NATIONWIDE LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 8 to request a hearing on an application filed by Nationwide Life Insurance Company, Nationwide Multi-Flex Variable Account, and Nationwide Financial Services, Inc. for an order granting exemptions from the provisions of Sections 26(a)(2)(C) and 27(c)(2) of the Investment Company Act to permit the deduction of a mortality and expense risk charge from the assets of the Variable Account. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

SYSTEM ENERGY RESOURCES, INC.; GEORGIA POWER COMPANY

Notices have been issued giving interested persons until November 7 to request a hearing on a proposal by the following companies filed under Release 35-24728, dated October 13: <u>SYSTEM ENERGY RESOURCES, INC. (SERI)</u> - subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, Inc., to sell and leaseback approximatley 10-15% of its 90% undivided ownership interest in Unit 1 of the Grand Gulf Steam Electric Generating Station. The aggregate fair market value is estimated not to exceed \$500 million. It is proposed that the aggregate cost will be provided by both equity investors and debt financing. A letter of credit will be provided in connection with the equity funding and SERI, pursuant to a Reimbursement Agreement, will be obligated to repay any amount drawn under the letter of credit. With respect to the portion of the cost to be borrowed, upon the occurrence of certain events, SERI will be obligated to assume the obligation of the notes; and <u>GEORGIA POWER COMPANY</u> - subsidiary of The Southern Company, to effect a series of transactions whereby Oglethorpe Power Corporation would acquire an interest, increasing over time, in Georgia Power's Rocky Mountain Pumped Storage Hydroelectric Project.

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

TEMPORARY APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission recently issued an order temporarily approving a rule change filed by the Depository Trust Company (SR-DTC-88-16). The proposal is to implement DTC's memo segregation service, which is designed to assist broker-dealer participants in protecting customer securities against unintended delivery and in complying with Commission Rule 15c3-3. EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Pacific Stock Exchange filed a proposed rule change which became immediately effective upon filing under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposal (SR-PSE-88-22) will charge PSE options members using a telephone or drop line installed in another option member's booth space \$100 per month for each telephone or drop line. APPROVAL AND ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission granted approval to a proposed rule change filed by the New York Stock Exchange (SR-NYSE-88-23) and granted accelerated approval to proposed rule changes filed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange, the National Association of Securities Dealers, and the American Stock Exchange (SR-CBOE-88-14; SR-NASD-88-46; SR-Amex-88-24) to implement coordinated circuit breaker procedures during volatile market conditions. The proposals provide for a one-hour halt in the trading of all stocks, stock options, and stock index options if the Dow Jones Industrial Average (DJIA) declines 250 points from its previous day's close; a second two-hour closing will occur if the DJIA falls 400 points.

The Commission also granted accelerated approval to an NYSE proposal (SR-NYSE-88-22) to apply certain limitations on program trading when the price of the Standard and Poor's 500 Stock Index futures contract traded on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange falls 12 points below the previous day's closing value. The Commission also granted accelerated approval to an NYSE proposal (SR-NYSE-88-24) to provide priority delivery to the specialist's post to individual investors' market orders of 2,099 or fewer shares on any trading day on which the DJIA moves 25 points from the previous day's close.
