- MEDIATION FEE: \$350. per hour, with five hour minimum charged per mediation/fact-finding session.
- CANCELLATION FEE and POLICY: Fee for scheduled dates adjourned, postponed or canceled with notice of less than thirty (30) calendar days of arbitration hearing or mediation/fact-finding session.
- **EXPENSES:** Cost of reasonable and necessary travel expenses, including airfare (coach), car rental or taxi, and lodging. No automobile mileage charged for hearings within a 100 mile radius of office(s). No charges for reasonable and ordinary administrative expenses. No charges for ordinary copying, phone or postal expenses.
- \*TRAVEL TIME: ½ Per Diem charged when travel exceeds 150 miles in one day.
