23	<u>COUNT ONE</u> : (18 U.S.C. §§ 371, 1831(a)(5), and 1832(a)(5))		
24	1. On or about a date unknown but at least by the summer of 2001, and continuing to on or		
25	about November 24, 2001, in the Northern District of California and elsewhere, the defendants		
26	FEI YE, a/k/a Ye Fei, and		
27 28	MING ZHONG, a/k/a Zhong Ming,

did knowingly conspire and agree with each other and other persons to commit the following offenses: economic espionage, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1831(a)(3); possession of stolen trade secrets, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1832(a)(3); and foreign transportation of stolen property, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2314.

- 2. It was part of the conspiracy that the defendants and other persons would and did establish and promote Supervision, Inc. (Supervision), a/k/a Hangzhou Zhongtian Microsystems Company Ltd., a/k/a Zhongtian Microsystems Corporation, to produce and sell microprocessors in the People's Republic of China (PRC).
- 3. It was further part of the conspiracy that the defendants and other persons would and did attempt to recruit others, including engineers, to participate in and work for the Supervision project.
- 4. It was further part of the conspiracy that the defendants and other persons would and did make representations to others they were recruiting for the Supervision project including the following:
- a. Funding for the Supervision project was being provided by the City of Hangzhou in the PRC;
- b. Supervision was also applying for funding from the 863 Program (The National High Technology Research and Development Program of China); and
- c. Supervision was working with a professor from Zhejiang University in the PRC, who was assisting in obtaining funding from the 863 Program.
- 5. It was further part of the conspiracy that the defendants would travel to the PRC and take with them documents and materials containing trade secrets belonging to Transmeta Corporation (Transmeta) and Sun Microsystems, Inc. (Sun).
- 6. In furtherance of the agreement and to effect its objects, the defendants committed, among others, the following overt acts in the Northern District of California:
- a. On or about November 23, 2001, defendant Fei Ye possessed documents and materials containing the trade secrets described in Counts Two, Three, and Nine of this Indictment belonging to Transmeta and Sun in the County of Santa Clara and at the San Francisco International Airport (SFO);

- b. On or about November 23, 2001, defendant Ming Zhong possessed documents and materials containing the trade secrets described in Counts Four, Five, and Ten of this Indictment belonging to Transmeta in the County of Santa Clara and at SFO;
- c. On or about November 23 and 24, 2001, defendant Fei Ye possessed documents and materials containing the trade secrets described in Count Six of this Indictment belonging to Sun, NEC Electronics Corporation (NEC), and Trident Microsystems, Inc. (Trident) at his residence in the County of Santa Clara;
- d. On or about November 23, 2001, defendant Ming Zhong possessed documents and materials containing the trade secrets described in Count Seven of this Indictment belonging to Trident at his residence in the County of Santa Clara;
- e. On or about November 23, 2001, defendant Ming Zhong possessed documents and materials containing the trade secrets described in Count Eight of this Indictment belonging to Trident at his Transmeta office in the County of Santa Clara;
- f. On or about November 23 and 24, 2001, defendant Fei Ye possessed a Corporate Charter for Hangzhou Zhongtian Microsystems Company Ltd. at his residence in the County of Santa Clara which states that the joint-venture will raise China's ability to develop super-integrated circuit design, and form a powerful capability to compete with worldwide leaders' core development technology and products in the field of integrated circuit design;
- g. On or about November 23 and 24, 2001, defendant Fei Ye possessed a Feasibility Report Review regarding Zhongtian Microsystems Corporation at his residence in the County of Santa Clara which states that The Panel of Experts have found unanimously that: the project has important significance for the development of China's high-level embedded CPU and the basic development of the system chip; the project will have a positive effect on the development of China's integrated circuit industry; and they recommend that every government department implement and provide energetic support;
- h. On or about November 23, 2001, defendant Ming Zhong possessed a Project Application Form for the National Special Foundation for Importing Knowledge of Software and Integrated Circuits printed by the National Bureau of Foreign Experts at his residence in the County

of Santa Clara which states that The Chinese Group of Experts are unanimous in thinking that: implementation of the Hangzhou Zhongtian Microsystems Ltd. project possesses tremendous significance with regard to both the autonomous Chinese development of an embedded CPU and for the basic development of system chips; the project will be extremely useful to the development of China's integrated circuit industry; and they suggest that every level of government offer their support toward the implementation of this project; and

i. On or about November 23, 2001, defendants Fei Ye and Ming Zhong attempted to board an aircraft at SFO bound for the PRC.

All in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 371, 1831(a)(5), and 1832(a)(5).

<u>COUNT TWO</u>: (18 U.S.C. §§ 1831(a)(3) and 2)

1. On or about November 23, 2001, in the Northern District of California, the defendant

FEI YE, a/k/a Ye Fei,

intending and knowing that the offense would benefit a foreign government; namely the PRC, and instrumentalities thereof including the City of Hangzhou, the 863 Program, and Zhejiang University, did knowingly possess trade secrets belonging to Transmeta and Sun, knowing the trade secrets to have been stolen, appropriated, and obtained without authorization.

- 2. Specifically, defendant Fei Ye knowingly possessed trade secrets belonging to Transmeta and Sun in the County of Santa Clara and in his luggage at SFO while attempting to board an aircraft bound for the PRC including the documents and materials identified as follows: (a) Transmeta p95f schematics, astro schematics, and four CDs containing astro project module files; and (b) Sun Physical Design Methodology Rev. 2.0 and NeWSprint 2.5.
 - 3. On or about November 23, 2001, in the Northern District of California, the defendant

MING ZHONG, a/k/a Zhong Ming, a/k/a Andy Zhong,

did knowingly and intentionally aid and abet defendant Fei Ye in the commission of the offense described in paragraphs 1 and 2 of this Count.

All in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1831(a)(3) and 2.

<u>COUNT THREE</u>: (18 U.S.C. §§ 1832(a)(3)and 2)

1. On or about November 23, 2001, in the Northern District of California, the defendant

FEI YE, a/k/a Ye Fei,

with intent to convert trade secrets belonging to Transmeta and Sun to the economic benefit of someone other than the owners thereof, which trade secrets are related to and included in products that are produced for and placed in interstate and foreign commerce, did knowingly possess such information knowing it to have been stolen, appropriated, obtained, and converted without authorization, and intending and knowing that his act would injure Transmeta and Sun.

- 2. Specifically, defendant Fei Ye knowingly possessed trade secrets belonging to Transmeta and Sun in the County of Santa Clara and in his luggage at SFO while attempting to board an aircraft bound for the PRC including the documents and materials identified as follows: (a) Transmeta p95f schematics, astro schematics, and four CDs containing astro project module files; and (b) Sun Physical Design Methodology Rev. 2.0 and NeWSprint 2.5.
 - 3. On or about November 23, 2001, in the Northern District of California, the defendant

MING ZHONG, a/k/a Zhong Ming, a/k/a Andy Zhong,

did knowingly and intentionally aid and abet defendant Fei Ye in the commission of the offense described in paragraphs 1 and 2 of this Count.

All in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1832(a)(3) and 2.

<u>COUNT FOUR</u>: (18 U.S.C. §§ 1831(a)(3) and 2)

1. On or about November 23, 2001, in the Northern District of California, the defendant

MING ZHONG, a/k/a Zhong Ming, a/k/a Andy Zhong,

intending and knowing that the offense would benefit a foreign government; namely the PRC, and instrumentalities thereof including the City of Hangzhou, the 863 Program, and Zhejiang University,

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did knowingly possess trade secrets belonging to Transmeta, knowing the trade secrets to have been stolen, appropriated, and obtained without authorization.

- 2. Specifically, defendant Ming Zhong knowingly possessed trade secrets belonging to Transmeta in the County of Santa Clara and in his luggage at SFO while attempting to board an aircraft bound for the PRC including the documents and materials identified as follows: technical information from Transmeta's intranet; computer aided design (CAD) scripts; and project Han schematics.
 - 3. On or about November 23, 2001, in the Northern District of California, the defendant

FEI YE, a/k/a Ye Fie,

did knowingly and intentionally aid and abet defendant Ming Zhong in the commission of the offense described in paragraphs 1 and 2 of this Count.

All in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1831(a)(3) and 2.

COUNT FIVE: (18 U.S.C. §§ 1832(a)(3)and 2)

1. On or about November 23, 2001, in the Northern District of California, the defendant

MING ZHONG, a/k/a Zhong Ming, a/k/a Andy Zhong,

with intent to convert trade secrets belonging to Transmeta to the economic benefit of someone other than the owner thereof, which trade secrets are related to and included in products that are produced for and placed in interstate and foreign commerce, did knowingly possess such information knowing it to have been stolen, appropriated, obtained, and converted without authorization, and intending and knowing that his act would injure Transmeta.

2. Specifically, defendant Ming Zhong knowingly possessed trade secrets belonging to Transmeta in the County of Santa Clara and at SFO while attempting to board an aircraft bound for the PRC including the documents and materials identified as follows: technical information from Transmeta's intranet; computer aided design (CAD) scripts; and project Han schematics.

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3. On or about November 23, 2001, in the Northern District of California, the defendant

FEI YE, a/k/a Ye Fei,

did knowingly and intentionally aid and abet defendant Ming Zhong in the commission of the offense described in paragraphs 1 and 2 of this Count.

All in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1832(a)(3) and 2.

COUNT SIX: (18 U.S.C. § 1832(a)(3))

1. On or about November 23 and 24, 2001, in the Northern District of California, the defendant

FEI YE, a/k/a Ye Fei,

with intent to convert trade secrets belonging to Sun, NEC, and Trident to the economic benefit of someone other than the owners thereof, which trade secrets are related to and included in products that are produced for and placed in interstate and foreign commerce, did knowingly possess such information knowing it to have been stolen, appropriated, obtained, and converted without authorization, and intending and knowing that his act would injure Sun, NEC, and Trident.

2. Specifically, the defendant knowingly possessed trade secrets belonging to Sun, NEC, and Trident at his residence in the County of Santa Clara including the documents and materials identified as follows: (a) Sun—SIU Incoming Transaction Implementation; DMU Datapath; Cheetah DCache Unit Review; Clocking in CCDM, Chapter 15.10; Power Consumption Estimation in CCDM, Chapter 15.15; 8K Page Size TLB Lsim Doc. in CCDM, Chapter 15; Noise, CCDM, Chapter 15.8; Ultra Sparc-III Programmer's Reference Manual; Floating Point Register File Core Megacell Specification; Safari Forward Progress; MMU Review; Fully Associative TLB Circuit Imp. Review; Different Clock Ratio Handling in DPCTL; EM Simulation Guidelines; Write Cache Review; IT8 Implementation Review; IU Standalone Test Guide, Revision .01; and Memory Management Unit; (b) NEC — VR5400 Microprocessor Specification; Excalibur schematics; VR4320 Cache Unit and other schematics; and UC III Device & Process parameters; and (c) Trident — schematics.

All in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1832(a)(3).

<u>COUNT SEVEN</u>: (18 U.S.C. § 1832(a)(3))

1. On or about November 23, 2001, in the Northern District of California, the defendant

MING ZHONG, a/k/a Zhong Ming, a/k/a Andy Zhong,

with intent to convert trade secrets belonging to Trident to the economic benefit of someone other than the owner thereof, which trade secrets are related to and included in products that are produced for and placed in interstate and foreign commerce, did knowingly possess such information knowing it to have been stolen, appropriated, obtained, and converted without authorization, and intending and knowing that his act would injure Trident.

2. Specifically, the defendant knowingly possessed trade secrets belonging to Trident at his residence in the County of Santa Clara including the documents and materials identified as follows: presentation entitled Image 975/985 2D/3D Graphics Engine; LVDS Connectors, Document Number 9913; and Ferrari-XP Pinout.

All in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1832(a)(3).

COUNT EIGHT: (18 U.S.C. § 1832(a)(3))

1. On or about November 23, 2001, in the Northern District of California, the defendant

MING ZHONG, a/k/a Zhong Ming, a/k/a Andy Zhong,

with intent to convert trade secrets belonging to Trident to the economic benefit of someone other than the owner thereof, which trade secrets are related to and included in products that are produced for and placed in interstate and foreign commerce, did knowingly possess such information knowing it to have been stolen, appropriated, obtained, and converted without authorization, and intending and knowing that his act would injure Trident.

2. Specifically, the defendant knowingly possessed trade secrets belonging to Trident at his Transmeta office in the County of Santa Clara including the documents and materials identified as follows: video engine display schematics; panel display documents; power management document; block diagram on power management; panel interface documents; Panel Display Technology slide

presentation; training documents; video function support document; and video function documents.

All in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1832(a)(3).

COUNT NINE: (18 U.S.C. §§ 2314 and 2)

1. On or about November 23, 2001, in the Northern District of California and elsewhere, the defendant

FEI YE, a/k/a Ye Fei,

did knowingly transport, transmit, and transfer in foreign commerce goods, wares, and merchandise of a value of more than \$5,000, knowing them to have been stolen, converted and taken by fraud.

- 2. Specifically, defendant Fei Ye knowingly transported, transmitted, and transferred in foreign commerce at SFO documents and materials containing trade secrets belonging to Transmeta and Sun including documents and materials identified as follows: (a) Transmeta p95f schematics and astro schematics; and (b) Sun Physical Design Methodology Rev. 2.0 and NeWSprint 2.5.
- 3. On or about November 23, 2001, in the Northern District of California and elsewhere, the defendant

MING ZHONG, a/k/a Zhong Ming, a/k/a Andy Zhong,

did knowingly and intentionally aid and abet defendant Fei Ye in the commission of the offense described in paragraphs 1 and 2 of this Count.

All in violation of Title 18, United States Code Sections 2314 and 2.

<u>COUNT TEN</u>: (18 U.S.C. §§ 2314 and 2)

1. On or about November 23, 2001, in the Northern District of California and elsewhere, the defendant

MING ZHONG, a/k/a Zhong Ming, a/k/a Andy Zhong,

did knowingly transport, transmit, and transfer in foreign commerce goods, wares, and merchandise of a value of more than \$5,000, knowing them to have been stolen, converted and taken by fraud.

1	2. Specifically, defendant Ming Zhong knowingly transported, transmitted, and transferred	
2	in foreign commerce at SFO documents and materials containing trade secrets belonging to	
3	Transmeta including documents and materials identified as follows: technical information from	
4	Transmeta's intranet; computer aided design (CAD) scripts; and project Han schematics.	
5	3. On or about November 23, 2001, in the Northern District of California and elsewhere, the
