## REPORT AND ORDER (Proceeding Terminated)

Adopted: August 2, 2002 Released: August 9, 2002

By the Chief, Video Division:

- 1. At the request of Georgia Public Telecommunication Commission ("GPTC"), licensee of stations WCES-TV, WVAN-TV, WXGA-TV, WACS-TV and WABW-TV, licensed to Wrens, Savannah, Waycross, Dawson, and Pelham, Georgia, respectively, the Commission has before it the Notice of Proposed Rule Making, 17 FCC Rcd 8595 (2002), proposing changes to the DTV Table of Allotments for the above-referenced communities. GPTC and The Box Worldwide LLC, licensee of WXSX-LP filed comments supporting the proposed channel substitutions. No other comments were filed.
- 2. We believe the public interest would be served by adopting the proposed channel substitutions in Georgia since it will enable GPTC to reduce its operating costs and operate its stations with lower powers. DTV channels \*2, \*13, \*9c, \*8, and \*5 can be allotted to Wrens, Savannah, Waycross, Dawson, Pelham, as proposed, in compliance with the principle community coverage requirement of Section 73.625(a). In addition, we find these channels acceptable under the 2 percent criterion for *de minimis* impact that is applied in evaluating requests for modification of initial DTV allotments under Section 73.623(c)(2)<sup>3</sup> for stations WCES-DT, WVAN-DT, WXGA-

In addition, WXGA's and WACS's proposals would cause more than 2 per cent interference to WVAN and WXGA's NTSC operations. Nevertheless, WVAN and WXGA have agreed to accept

Accordingly, pursuant to the authority contained in Sections 4(i), 5(c)(1), 303(g) and (r) and 307(b) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, and Sections 0.61, 0.204(b) and 0.283 of the Commission's Rules, IT IS ORDERED, That effective September 23, 2002, the DTV Table of Allotments, Section 73.622(b) of the Commission's Rules, IS AMENDED, with respect to the communities listed below, to read as follows:

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That within 45 days of the effective date of this <u>Order</u>, Georgia Public Telecommunications Commission shall submit to the Commission minor change applications for construction permits (FCC Form 340) specifying the channel changes reflected in this *Report and Order* for stations WCES-DT, WVAN-DT, WXGA-DT, WACS-DT and WABW-DT.
