Descriptive Report
to accompany Top^c Sheet N^o 2045, of the
Connecticut River between Rocky Hill
and Methersfield, Connecticut.

1. The general character of this district is that of a flat alluvial valley, through which the river winds, bordered by low rounded hills of drift, which toward the southern edge of the sheet rise higher and approach each other to form a pass through which the river flows.

8. The hills are wooded with a mixed deciduous growth. Most of the land, especially in the valley, is in grass with numerous trees scattered or in clumps or rows. A large proportion of these scattered trees are elms.

9. The villages of Rocky Hill, South Methersfield, Glastonbury, and South Glastonbury are within the limits of the sheet. They are old settlements, depending chiefly on agriculture though there are mills at South Glastonbury.

There are steamers from Hartford to New York, stopping at river landings and on the west bank is the Valley Branch of the N.Y., N.H., & Hartford R.R.
