S. 2054

A bill to direct the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study of water resources in the state of Vermont

As ordered reported by the Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources on May 24, 2006

S. 2054 would direct the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study of water resources in Vermont. The study, to be completed within two years of the bill's enactment, would include a survey of groundwater supplies available to municipalities. Based on the cost of similar studies, CBO estimates that carrying out the proposed study would cost the U.S. Geological Survey about \$6 million over the next few years, assuming appropriation of the necessary amounts. Enacting S. 2054 would not affect direct spending or revenues.

The bill contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would impose no costs on state, local, or tribal governments.
