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# Thailand Grain and Feed Weekly Rice Price Update 2007

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### **Report Highlights:**

Export prices were offered \$2-3/MT higher due to the continued strengthening Thai baht. Freight costs remain a major concern despite a 10 percent drop in bulk vessel prices.

### **Market Tone**

Despite a slight domestic price slowdown from increasing second-crop harvest supplies, export prices for most grades of rice rose by \$2-3/MT due to the continued strengthening Thai Baht. The Thai Baht reached a new high of 33.7 baht/\$U.S., as compared to the strengthening 34 baht/\$U.S. last week. Iran and Iraq are still buying Thai rice regularly, but import demand from African and European countries has been quiet due to concerns over high freight costs. Current freight costs of bulk vessels, particularly to African countries, are still high despite a recent 10 percent cost reduction from the previous week. Although freight costs for container vessels seasonally increase by almost double, particularly to Europe, freight costs this year remain much higher. Trade sources allege vessel owners are attempting take advantage of the relative high demand for their vessels.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. The authority to report fragrant rice exports was moved from the Thai Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official fragrant rice export data. FAS/BKK will report only official export numbers from the Board of Trade for non-fragrant and from the Office of Commodity Standards for fragrant rice when available, but the reader should bear in mind the difference between the data.

Unofficial exports (excluding fragrant rice) for Jul. 2-8, 2007 totaled 91,843 tons, down 284 tons from the previous week's total, and down 10,129 tons from the four-week moving average of 101,972 tons. Export during Jan. 1 – Jul 8, 2007 totaled 2,693,173 tons, as compared with 2,533,918 tons in the previous year.

According to the Department of Foreign Trade, Ministry of Commerce, total rice exports (including fragrant rice) during Jan. 1 – Jun. 28, 2007, amounted to 3,986,205 tons, up 9.4 percent from 3,642,639 tons in the previous year.
