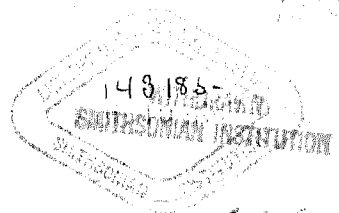

THE ELEMENTS OF POPULATION.

RELATIVE PROPORTIONS OF MALES AND FEMALES, NATIVE AND FOREIGN BORN, AND
WHITE AND COLORED, IN 1890, 1880, AND 1870

BY STATES AND TERRITORIES.

This bulletin gives the relative proportions of females to males, of foreign born to native born, and of colored to white, as shown at the last 3 decennial censuses.

RELATIVE PROPORTION OF FEMALES TO MALES.

The whole number of males in the United States in 1890 is 32,067,880 and the whole number of females 30,554,370. For the United States as a whole, therefore, there are for every 100,000 males 95,280 females in 1890. In 1880 there were 96,544 females to every 100,000 males, while in 1870 there were 97,801 females to every 100,000 males. The females exceed the males in 1890 to a greater extent than 5 per cent in the District of Columbia, Massachusetts, and Rhode Island.

The table following gives by states and territories, arranged geographically, the whole number of males and females as returned under the census of 1890 and the number of females to each 100,000 males for the censuses of 1890, 1880, and 1870.

The greatest preponderance of females in 1890 is found in the District of Columbia, or 110,242 females to 100,000 males. In 1880 also the District of Columbia contained the highest proportion of females to males, or 112,525 females to every 100,000 males. In Massachusetts, the state having the next greatest excess of females over males in 1890, there were 105,840 females to 100,000 males, while in Rhode Island, the state showing the third largest excess of females over males, there were 105,628 females to every 100,000 males. In 1880 Rhode Island was second as to the excess of females, with 107,871 females to every 100,000 males, and Massachusetts third, with 107,712 females to every 100,000 males.

In 1880 there were 7 states which showed an excess of females over males from 2.5 to 5 per cent, namely, Connecticut, with 103,642 females to every 100,000 males; New Hampshire, with 103,483 females to every 100,000 males; North Carolina, with 103,479 females to every 100,000 males; South Carolina, with 103,010 females to every 100,000 males; New York, with 102,883 females to every 100,000 males; Virginia, with 102,868 females to every 100,000 males, and Alabama, with 102,770 females to every 100,000 males; in 1890 there were none reported as having similar percentages of excess.

The states in 1880 in which the excess of females was less than 2.5 per cent of the males were 7 in number, namely, Maryland, with 102,287 females to every 100,000 males; Georgia, with 102,126 females to every 100,000 males; New Jersey, with 102,013 females to every 100,000 males; Louisiana, with 100,520 females to every 100,000 males; Tennessee, with 100,495 females to every 100,000 males; Pennsylvania, with 100,448 females to every 100,000 males, and Maine, with 100,253 females to every 100,000 males, as against 8 in 1890, namely, North Carolina, with 102,459 females to every 100,000 males; Maryland, with 102,135 females to every 100,000 males; Connecticut, with 101,944 females to every 100,000 males; New Hampshire, with 101,821 females to every 100,000 males; New York, with 101,480 females to every 100,000 males; New Jersey, with 100,457 females to every 100,000 males; South Carolina, with 101,131 females to every 100,000 males, and Virginia, with 100,901 females to every 100,000 males.

The whole number of states and territories where the females exceed the males in 1890 is 11 as against 17 in 1880. All of the states and territories showing an excess of females over males in 1890 are found in the North Atlantic and South Atlantic divisions, as was also true of the states and territories having an excess of females over males in 1880, with the exception of Alabama, Louisiana, and Tennessee in the South Central division.

In 1880 there were 5 states and territories in which the number of females was less than 50 per cent of the males, namely, Idaho, Nevada, Wyoming, Arizona, and Montana, while in 1890 there is no state or territory where the females do not represent at least 50 per cent of the males.

In 1890 there are 11 states and territories, mainly in the Western division, in which the females represent from 50 to 80 per cent of the males as against 5 states and territories in 1880.

For the remaining states and territories the females represent over 80 per cent but less than 100 per cent of the males.

CHANGES SINCE 1880 IN THE RELATIVE PROPORTIONS OF FEMALES TO MALES, THE NUMBER OF MALES BEING ASSUMED AS 100,000.

The females as compared with the males have lost relatively since 1880 in the United States as a whole, the numerical loss being 1,264 to each 100,000 males as against a relative loss in 1880 of 1,257 females to each 100,000 males. There has been a relative loss during the decade of 2,070 females to each 100,000 males in the North Atlantic division; of 1,716 females to each 100,000 males in the South Atlantic division, and 1,411 females to each 100,000 males in the South Central division. There has been a slight increase relatively, on the other hand, of 269 to each 100,000 males in the North Central division, and 4,650 females to each 100,000 males in the Western division. In 19 states and territories there has been a relative increase of females to each 100,000 males, while in 29 states and territories there has been a relative decrease of females to each 100,000 males, as is shown by the following table, giving in addition to the increase or decrease in 1890 the increase or decrease as shown by the census of 1880 as compared with 1870 :

The increase of females since 1880 for North Dakota and South Dakota is for these 2 states combined as compared with Dakota territory in 1880 and 1870.

In all the states and territories comprising the North Atlantic and South Atlantic divisions the females have decreased relatively as compared with males. This is also largely true of the South Central division, the females having decreased relatively in all the states and territories, with the exception of Texas.

In Oklahoma in 1890 there are 78,027 females to each 100,000 males.

The females have increased relatively as regards males in all the states comprising the North Central division, with the exception of Ohio and Wisconsin. The females have also increased relatively as compared with the males in the states and territories comprising the Western division, with the exception of New Mexico, Utah, and Washington.

The table following gives for each state and territory, arranged geographically, the whole number of native and foreign born returned in 1890, together with the number of foreign born to each 100,000 native born, as returned in 1890, 1880, and 1870.

There are in the United States as a whole 17,330 foreign born persons to each 100,000 native born persons in 1890 as against 15,365 in 1880 and 16,875 in 1870. There has been an increase in the number of foreign born to each 100,000 native born for the North Atlantic division from 24,070 in

1880 to 28,773 in 1890, and in the North Central division from 20,189 to 22,184. In the Western division there has been a decrease in the number of foreign born to each 100,000 native born in 1890 as compared with 1880, or 34,161 in 1890 as against 39,448 in 1880. In the South Atlantic and South Central divisions the foreign born element is not numerically of importance, there being only 3,021 foreign born to each 100,000 native born in 1890 in the South Central division, and but 2,411 in the South Atlantic division.

In 2 states in 1890 the foreign born represent more than 50 per cent of the native born, or 80,449 foreign born in North Dakota, and 56,006 foreign born in Minnesota, to each 100,000 native born. In 1880 there were 5 states and territories in which the foreign born represented more than 50 per cent of the native born, namely, Nevada, with 70,065 foreign born to each 100,000 native born; Arizona, with 65,799 foreign born to each 100,000 native born; Dakota, with 62,118 foreign born to each 100,000 native born; Minnesota, with 52,169 foreign born to each 100,000 native born, and California, with 51,218 foreign born to each 100,000 native born.

The foreign born represent from 25 to 50 per cent of the native born in 18 states and territories in 1890 as compared with 13 states and territories in 1880, 9 of the states and territories in 1890 being in the Western division, while the remainder are about equally divided between the North Atlantic and North Central divisions.

The foreign born represent from 10 to 25 per cent of the native born in 9 states in 1890 as compared with 11 states and territories in 1880; from 2 to 10 per cent in 12 states and territories in 1890 as against 10 states and territories in 1880, and less than 2 per cent in 8 states in both 1890 and 1880.

In 24 states and territories the foreign born have increased relatively since 1880 while in 24 they have decreased relatively.

In the above table the results for North Dakota and South Dakota in 1890 have been combined for purposes of comparison with the results for Dakota territory in 1880 and in 1870.

In Oklahoma in 1890 there are 4,637 foreign born to each 100,000 native born.

In the United States as a whole the foreign element has increased relatively in 1890, an increase of 1,965 to each 100,000 native born, as against a relative decrease in 1880 of 1,510 to each 100,000 native born.

The colored exceed the white in 1890 in 3 states only, namely, in South Carolina, or 149,117 colored to 100,000 white; in Mississippi, or 136,237 colored to 100,000 white, and in Louisiana, or 100,143 colored to 100,000 white. These same states also showed an excess of colored in 1880, as

follows: South Carolina, 154,519 colored to 100,000 white; Mississippi, 135,647 colored to 100,000 white, and Louisiana, 106,309 colored to 100,000 white.

In 5 states in 1890 the colored represent more than 50 per cent of the white, namely, Georgia, Alabama, Florida, Virginia, and North Carolina. In these same states in 1880 the colored also represented more than 50 per cent of the white population. The colored population of the District of Columbia represented in 1880 more than 50 per cent of the white population, while in 1890 it represents but 48.85 per cent of the white population.

Besides the District of Columbia there are 4 states in 1890 where the colored population represents from 25 to 50 per cent of the white population, the same as in 1880, namely, Arkansas, Tennessee, Texas, and Maryland.

In 1890 and also in 1880 there are but 2 states where the colored population represents from 10 to 25 per cent of the white population, namely, Kentucky and Delaware.

Of the remaining states and territories in 1890, 10 have a colored population which represents from 2 to 10 per cent of the white population as compared with 8 states in 1880, while in 24 states and territories the colored element represents less than 2 per cent of the white population, both in 1890 and in 1880.

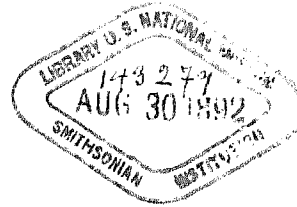

In the above table the results for North and South Dakota in 1890 have been combined for comparison with those for Dakota territory in 1880 and 1870.

For the United States as a whole in 1890 there has been a relative decrease of colored, or 1,576 to each 100,000 white as compared with a relative increase from 1870 to 1880 of 634 to each 100,000 white. In the South Atlantic division there has been a relative decrease in 1890 of 4,852 colored to each 100,000 white, and in the South Central division of 4,584 colored to each 100,000 white.

This bulletin gives the number of persons of school age, or from 5 to 20 years, inclusive; the number of males of militia age, or from 18 to 44 years, inclusive; the number of males of voting age, or 21 years and over, classified as to color and general nativity, together with a separate statement for foreign born adult males as to the number who have been naturalized, who have taken out first naturalization papers, or who are aliens.

The figures contained in this bulletin are the results of the first detailed count of population according to color, sex, and general nativity, and are subject to correction.

The significance of the term "school age" varies in the different states and territories, and there is no school age in the national statutes. The term has found a place in national census reports, but it is perplexing since its limitations are not always clear.

In addition to the general variation already indicated, certain states take account of those between two or three sets of age limits, using each for a different purpose.

Oklahoma organized public schools after the close of the census year.

In Vermont the former maximum of 20 years has been restored since 1890, although at the time the census was taken the age limitations were 5 to 18, under a then recent law by which the maximum was reduced to 18.

The statement following presents the variations of age limits for the school census as required by the various state laws in 1890. In each case the year last named is not inclusive.

In the published reports of previous censuses statements concerning persons commonly considered as being of school age, that is, of the ages when children are found attending school, have been limited to 5 to 17 years, both inclusive. Under the present census, however, results are given covering persons from 5 to 17 years, from 18 to 20 years, and from 5 to 20 years as a total, both years in each case being inclusive, classified by color, sex, and general nativity. These results are presented in the series of tables following, by states and territories.

The whole number of persons from 5 to 17 years of age in the United States, under the census of 1890, is 18,543,201 as against 15,065,767 returned in 1880, showing an increase during the decade of 3,477,434, or 23.08 per cent. The whole number of persons from 18 to 20 years of age in the United States in 1890 is 3,904,191 as against 3,254,063 in 1880, the increase during the decade being 650,128, or 19.98 per cent. Taking the period from 5 to 20 years of age as a whole, there were returned in 1890 for the entire United States 22,447,392 persons as against 18,319,830 persons in 1880, the general increase during the decade for the period of years considered being, therefore, 4,127,562, or 22.53 per cent. The increase in aggregate population for the United States as a whole during the same decade was 24.86 per cent.

In the North Atlantic division there has been an increase during the decade in the number of persons from 5 to 17 years, inclusive, of 13.34 per cent, and in those from 18 to 20 years of 17.15 per cent, as against an increase in total population for this division of 19.95 per cent.

In the Western division there has been an increase of 65.82 per cent for persons from 5 to 17 years, of 61.15 per cent for persons from 18 to 20 years, as against an increase in total population for the Western division of 71.27 per cent.

The total native born in 1890 as a whole represents 85.23 per cent, and the total foreign born 14.77 per cent, of the aggregate population for the United States.

For the United States as a whole 74.33 per cent of the males of voting age are native born and 25.67 per cent are foreign born. In the South Atlantic division but 5.07 per cent and in the South Central division but 6.55 per cent of the males of voting age are foreign born. In the Western division 41.67 per cent of the males of voting age are foreign born.

In the present census information regarding citizenship of foreign born males of voting age has been obtained for the first time as a part of the decennial census, giving a subdivision for this class of persons according to the number who have been naturalized, who have taken out first naturalization papers, or who are aliens. For a little less than 10 per cent of the whole number of foreign born adult males no information regarding citizenship was obtained by the census enumerators. In addition to the above, a further classification is given regarding aliens as to the number who can speak the English language and the number who speak other languages but can not speak the English language. This information regarding citizenship, by states and territories, is given in the table following.

The whole number of foreign born adult males in the United States in 1890 is 4,348,459. Of this number 1,160,214, or 26.68 per cent, are returned as aliens; 2,546,037, or 58.55 per cent, have been naturalized; 236,069, or 5.43 per cent, have taken out their first naturalization papers, while for 406,139, or 9.34 per cent, no information regarding citizenship was obtained. In the North Atlantic division 34.43 per cent and in the Western division 32.09 per cent of the foreign born adult males are aliens.

Classifying aliens according to their ability to speak the English language or not, it is seen that for the United States as a whole 68.25 per cent can speak the English language, while 31.75 per cent do not speak the English language. The percentages in detail, by states and territories, are given in the following table:

The states showing the highest percentages of aliens who can not speak the English language are Arizona, 65.81 per cent; Texas, 60.54 per cent; New Mexico, 54.31 per cent; Oregon, 50.48 per cent; California, 43.43 per cent; Florida, 43.14 per cent; Wisconsin, 42.23 per cent; Pennsylvania, 41.40 per cent, and Idaho, 40.53 per cent.

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STATISTICS OF CHURCHES.

This bulletin, which presents the statistics of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, and the Congregational churches, is the tenth in the series issued for religious bodies. It was prepared by HENRY K. CARROLL, LL. D., special agent in charge of this part of the Sixth Division.

The ninth bulletin gives the returns for the Methodist Episcopal Church, which is commonly known as the parent body of American Methodism. The Methodist Episcopal Church, South, which became a distinct branch in 1845, was due to a separation provided for by the general conference which met in New York in 1844. A difference in the administration of the discipline on the subject of slavery was the cause of separation. The somewhat indefinite line of division between the north and the south agreed upon in the plan of separation was not adhered to by both sides. During the late war the northern church followed the northern armies into the south, and after the restoration of peace gradually established churches all over the south. The southern church has not extended itself far to the northward, except on the Pacific coast, where it has conferences including, besides California, the states of Oregon, Washington, Idaho, and Montana. It also has congregations in Indiana and Illinois. The returns show that the church has 42 annual conferences in this country exclusive of 3 in mission fields abroad, with 1,209,976 members and 15,017 organizations. These organizations have in all 12,687 $\frac{1}{2}$ church edifices which, with their contents and the lots on which they stand, are valued at \$18,775,362. It is a fact worthy of note that of the more than 200,000 colored members reported by this church in 1860, only a very few remain in connection with it. Thousands at the close of the war joined other Methodist bodies, and in 1870 the church set off most of those it then had into a separate organization known as the Colored Methodist Episcopal Church, the returns of which are yet to be presented.

The Methodist Episcopal Church, South, is strongest in Texas, where it has 139,347 members; Georgia is second, with 134,600; Tennessee third, with 121,398; North Carolina fourth, with 114,385; Alabama fifth, with 87,912.

The statistics of the Congregational denomination show that Massachusetts, where the Pilgrims and Puritans established churches of the Congregational order early in the seventeenth century, is still the stronghold of Congregationalism. It has in that state nearly 102,000 members. In Connecticut, which comes second, there are 59,154, and in New York, 45,686. In

New England states the aggregate of Congregational strength is nearly 230,000, which is 7 per cent of the whole number of members in the United States. The proportion of to population in Massachusetts is 1 to 22.0; in Vermont, 1 to 16.2; in Connecticut, in New Hampshire, 1 to 19.1; in Maine, 1 to 30.7; in Rhode Island, 1 to 48.0. STATISTICS OF CHURCHES.

BY HENRY K. CARROLL.

This bulletin contains the statistics of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, and the Congregational churches.

THE METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH, SOUTH.

This body was organized at a convention held in Louisville, Kentucky, in 1845, by annual conferences in the south, which had accepted a plan of separation adopted by the general conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church at its meeting in New York in 1844. The cause of separation was the slavery question.

This question, which gave rise to much discussion and several divisions among Methodists, engaged their attention as early as 1780, 4 years before American Methodism was given organized form. A conference held in Baltimore in 1780 took action requiring traveling preachers who held slaves to set them free and advising lay slaveholders to do likewise. In 1789 the following appeared in the discipline among the rules prohibiting certain things:

The buying or selling the bodies and souls of men, women, or children, with an intention to enslave them.

The conference of 1784, which organized the Methodist Episcopal Church, deemed it a "bounden duty" to take effective measures to "extirpate this abomination from among us". It accordingly insisted that all those holding slaves should adopt a system of manumission, failing in which they should be excluded from the church, and that in future no slaveholder should be admitted to the church until he had ceased to hold slaves. In 1800 the discipline provided that any minister becoming a slaveholder must, if legally possible under the laws of the state in which he lived, emancipate his slaves or "forfeit his ministerial character". In 1816 the general conference declared slaveholders ineligible to any official station in the church, except in states where the laws did not "admit of emancipation and permit the liberated slave to enjoy freedom". These provisions could not be observed in some of the states in the south, and were not insisted on in the Carolinas, Georgia, and Tennessee. In 1808 the general conference directed that a number of disciplines, "with the section and rule on slavery left out", be printed for use in South Carolina.

About 25 years later the antislavery agitation in the north began to affect Methodism. The general conference of 1836 exhorted the members of the church "to abstain from all abolition movements and associations", and censured 2 of its members for taking part in an antislavery meeting. In the south the rule concerning the connection of ministers with slavery had not been enforced, except in 6 of the border conferences. The episcopacy, however, had been kept free from any conflict with slaveholding. While the northern conferences would not have received a slaveholding bishop, the southern conferences could not agree that slaveholders ought to be excluded from the episcopacy. A serious conflict arose, therefore, when Bishop Andrew, a southern man who was elected bishop in 1832, became by marriage in January, 1844, a slaveholder. At the general conference held in May of that year in New York city, after a long discussion it was declared, by a vote of 111 to 69, to be the sense of the conference that Bishop Andrew "desist from the exercise of his office so long as he is connected with slavery". The southern delegates protested against this action, and insisted that under the circumstances the "continuance of the jurisdiction of this general conference" over the conferences in the slaveholding states was "inconsistent with the success of the ministry" in those states. The outcome was the adoption

of a report of a committee of 9 embodying a plan of separation to become operative, if the 13 annual conferences in the slaveholding states should "find it necessary to unite in a distinct ecclesiastical connection, and if the various annual conferences by a three-fourths vote should so change the constitution as to allow of a division of the property of the Book Concern".

The action of the general conference was followed, in the south, by a convention in Louisville, Kentucky, in May, 1845, representing the 13 annual conferences which had expressed their approval of the plan of separation. This convention declared the conferences represented a distinct body under the title, "The Methodist Episcopal Church, South". 2 bishops, Andrew and Soule, cast their lot with the southern church; the former in 1845, the latter at the first general conference in 1846. The northern annual conferences disapproved the plan of separation and the general conference of 1848 declared it null and void. A suit for a division of the property, according to the plan of separation, was prosecuted and the Supreme Court of the United States, in 1854, decided it in favor of the southern church. A fraternal messenger sent by the latter to the northern general conference of 1848 was not received officially by that body. It was not until after the civil war, 1876, that fraternity was established between the 2 churches.

The southern church lost more heavily during the years of the war than the northern. The latter had in 1864 about 68,000 fewer members than in 1860, the decrease occurring chiefly in the border conferences. The former lost, between the years 1860 and 1866, 113,000 white members, while its colored membership aggregating 207,766 dwindled to 78,742. Most of the colored members went, at the close of the war, into the Methodist Episcopal Church (which extended its operations into the south), and into the African Methodist Episcopal and African Methodist Episcopal Zion churches. In 1870 nearly all the remaining colored members were organized into the Colored Methodist Episcopal Church. There are now only about 500 colored members in the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, and these are scattered among 27 annual conferences. In the Indian Mission Conference about 3,500 of the 10,498 members are Indians.

The southern church reorganized its shattered forces at the close of the war, and in a few years was again in the full tide of prosperity. Its growth in the last decade has been rapid.

The Methodist Episcopal Church, South, has the same articles of religion, the same system of conferences, annual and general, and substantially the same discipline as the Methodist Episcopal Church. It differs from the latter in admitting lay delegates (4 from each district) to the annual conferences; in making lay equal to ministerial representation in the general conference; in giving the bishops a modified veto over legislation which they may deem unconstitutional, and in abolishing the probationary term of 6 months for candidates for membership. The changes respecting lay delegation and the probationary system were adopted in 1866. The pastoral term was, in the same year, extended from 2 to 4 years.

There are 45 annual conferences, covering the entire country south of the 40th parallel of latitude, which nearly corresponds with Mason and Dixon's line, and also parts of Oregon, Montana, Idaho, and Washington; but the number of congregations in these states is not large. Nor are there many congregations in the southern portions of Indiana and Illinois. The church is strongest in Texas, where it has 139,347 members; in Georgia, where it has 134,600, and in Tennessee, where the number reaches 121,398. There are in all 1,209,976 members, with 15,017 organizations, 12,687 $\frac{1}{2}$ edifices, which are valued at \$18,775,362. Of the congregations, 1,634 meet in halls, schoolhouses, and private houses. The average seating capacity of the church edifices is 265, and the average value, \$1,480.

45,686; Illinois fourth, with 35,830, and Ohio fifth, with 32,281. Of the total valuation of church property, \$43,335,437, Massachusetts has more than a fourth, or \$11,030,890; Connecticut, \$5,366,201; New York, \$5,175,262, and Illinois, \$2,975,812. There are only 15 places in Massachusetts used by Congregationalists as places of worship which they do not own. There are 62 such places in South Dakota, 50 in Iowa, and 47 in Michigan. In all 456 halls, etc., are used by congregations. The 4,868 organizations own 4,736½ edifices, with an aggregate seating capacity of 1,553,080, indicating an average of 328 to each house. The average value of each edifice is \$9,150.

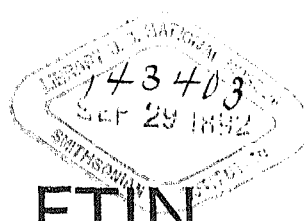

INMATES OF JUVENILE REFORMATORIES.

This bulletin shows the offenses charged against 14,846 inmates of juvenile reformatories, June 1, 1890. The offenses charged against adult prisoners were shown in the note appended to Bulletin No. 182, with which this can be compared, as follows:

Other comparisons can be made by color, race, and nativity, but need not be inserted here. Nearly one-half the offenses of youthful delinquents appear to be against social order, but of adults less than one-fourth. The offenses against property, in adults, are 45.8 per cent; but in children and youth only 30.4 per cent of the entire number. The offenses against the person, in adults, are 21.0 per cent; but in children and youth only 2.1 per cent, or about one-tenth as many. The social peril of juvenile crime is in its irregularity, not in its audacity. It is the promise of future peril, rather than a present danger.

INMATES OF JUVENILE REFORMATORIES.

CLASSIFIED BY AGE, SEX, AND OFFENSES CHARGED.

BY FREDERICK HOWARD WINES.

The number of inmates of juvenile reformatories June 1, 1890, was 14,846, namely, 11,535 males and 3,311 females.

Their distribution by institutions was shown in Census Bulletin No. 72.

Tables 1 and 2 of the present bulletin show the offenses with which they are charged. Table 1 deals with males and Table 2 with females. A summary statement is prefixed, in which the aggregate number of offenses for both sexes taken together are grouped, but the list in detail is contained only in the tables, which are arranged by elements of the population.

Tables 3 and 4 show the number of offenses charged classified by geographical divisions, states, and territories, for each sex separately.

Tables 5 and 6 show the ages of inmates of juvenile reformatories by single ages and by quinquennial periods, by geographical divisions, and states and territories, for each sex separately.
