1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

### 3 SECTION 1. METHANOL, SODIUM SALT.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.01.36 of the Har5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
6 methanol, sodium salt) is amended by striking "12/31/
7 2006" and inserting "12/31/2008".

8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
9 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
10 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
11 the date of the enactment of this Act.
