## S. 2171

## A bill to extend the deadline under the Federal Power Act applicable to the construction of a hydroelectric project in the state of Arkansas

As ordered reported by the Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources on July 29, 1998

CBO estimates that enacting S. 2171 would have no net effect on the federal budget. The bill contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act of 1995 and would not affect the budgets of state, local, or tribal governments.

S. 2171 would extend for up to six years the deadline for constructing a hydroelectric project currently subject to licensing by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). The proposed extension is for FERC project number 10455. This provision may have a minor impact on FERC's workload. Because FERC recovers 100 percent of its costs through user fees, any change in its administrative costs would be offset by an equal change in the fees that the commission charges. Hence, the provision would have no net budgetary impact.

Because FERC's administrative costs are limited in annual appropriations, enactment of this legislation would not affect direct spending or receipts. Therefore, pay-as-you-go procedures would not apply.
