Dear Ms. Cobo:

I am hoping this letter will spare some other person the tragedy that almost befell me on Labor Day. I was fixing dinner for friends and preparing to try out a recipe for "Fried Green Tomatoes." I planned to transfer the tomatoes to the oven to stay warm so I placed a Pyrex glass pie plate on the top of the stove on an unlit front burner. On the burner behind it, I was getting ready to heat water for corn on-the-cob.

As I was reaching to turn on the rear burner, a friend called to me from the living room to join the conversation. I had planned to next slice the tomatoes and dredge them in the flour mixture before frying them in a pan with bacon grease gradually warming up. Instead, I stepped into the livingroom to briefly join our company. I feel I was "called" out of the kitchen.

I was there no more than a few minutes when a resounding BOOM!!! shook the kitchen. The Pyrex pie plate had exploded into hundreds of pieces. Lethal shards, dagger-like slivers, and lacerating fragments were spewed from one corner of the kitchen to the other, landing even atop the refrigerator. One shard melted my new linoleum where it fell.

I had inadvertently turned on the wrong burner, the one under the Pyrex pie plate. My son said that in the wake of the explosion he could hear glass raining down for several seconds. I could have been killed, or blinded, and at the very least disfigured.

My call to the Corning consumer line garnered me little satisfaction: a \$5.00 coupon and the explanation that although Corning uses a special process to safeguard its chemistry lab Pyrex glassware, Corning does not use that same process on its pie plates and casserole dishes. The company believes that the imprint on the bottom of the kitchenware, "For oven and microwave. No rangetop or broiler," is warning enough.

I am an excruciatingly careful person but mistakes have a way of happening when you are distracted. If Corning can make some of its glassware safer, shouldn't it make them ALL equally safe? You don't imagine it's because most chemists are male and most cooks are female? Do you?



Dear Mr. Stevenson:

I am advised you may have information relating to accidents with various products, including glass and/or ceramics.

I represent an individual who sustained serious injury, including the severing of three ligaments, the artery and the ulnar nerve in his right forearm. The product was trademarked "VISIONS RANGETOP COOKWARE" or "VISIONS" or "PYREX" and was manufactured by Corning Glass Works, which I believe is now called, Corning, Incorporated, of Corning, New York.

The incident occurred February 27, 1993 in Santa Cruz, California when the product slipped out of my client's hand and fell 2.5 inches to possibly 4 inches onto the edge of an enamel sink that overlapped the counter. The result was an explosion, bursting, or failure that caused a large (over 3" long) piece to fly into my client's arm, another to fly to his left about 6 feet, and another to fly to his right, hit and break a dinner plate, coming to rest about 4 feet from him. Other pieces fell all around within the area.











To Whom It May Concern:

Rarely will I take the time to comment about a manufacturer's product unless well-deserved praise is deserved or extreme dissatisfaction should be noted.

Last night while eating dinner, my Corelle dinner plate, pattern: Oriental Blossums, "exploded" in front of me and my guests. After we removed the pieces of plate from the table we again watched another similar "eruption" from the plate several minutes later.

I called your toll-free number immediately to inquire why this happened for the first time in the three years the plates have been in use. Your telephone representative, Michael, told me that, "if the Corelle dishes because they are glass have ever been bumped,... any time after , they may break." He offered me a discount for another set of Corelle because my pattern has been discontinued. A discount was of no interest to me whatsoever but rather my concern regarding the simple safety factor of having a plate randomly explode causing injury to an unsuspecting person. Corning's one year replacement warranty is of no value to anyone injured by exploding glass.

I have never in my 40 years of using both glass and china plates ever witnessed a plate explode in this matter and I will inform friends and family who currently own Corelle to beware.

My entire set of Corelle has been disposed of and any future products manufactured by Corning have been removed from my future purchases.
