#### PENDING BUSINESS

### CONFERENCE REPORT ON H.R. 2082

Conference report to accompany H.R. 2082, an act to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2008 for intelligence and intelligence-related activities of the United States Government, the Community Management Account, and the Central Intelligence Agency Retirement and Disability System, and for other purposes. (Feb. 11, 2008.)

### PENDING BUSINESS

S. 1200 (ORDER NO. 421)

A bill to amend the Indian Health Care Improvement Act to revise and extend that act. (Jan. 22, 2008.)

### UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

S. 2248 (ORDER NO. 512)

1.—Ordered, That at 10:00 a.m., on Tuesday, February 12, 2008, the Senate resume consideration of S. 2248, a bill to amend the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978, to modernize and streamline the provisions of that act, and for other purposes, and the Senate proceed to vote in relation to the amendments in the order specified below, with two minutes of debate prior to each vote, equally divided and controlled in the usual form, and any succeeding votes in the sequence be limited to 10 minutes; provided, that no further amendments be in order on Tuesday; provided further, that each Leader control a total of 10 minutes of debate time to be used prior to any of the votes:

Amdt. No. 3920, offered by the Senator from Rhode Island (Mr. Whitehouse); Amdt. No. 3910, offered by the Senator from California (Mrs. Feinstein);

Amdt. No. 3979, offered by the Senator from Wisconsin (Mr. Feingold) and the Senator

from Virginia (Mr. Webb);
Amdt. No. 3907, offered by the Senator from Connecticut (Mr. Dodd) and the Senator from Wisconsin (Mr. Feingold):

Amdt. No. 3912, offered by the Senator from Wisconsin (Mr. Feingold);

Amdt. No. 3938, offered by the Senator from Missouri (Mr. Bond) and the Senator from West Virginia (Mr. Rockefeller), as modified;

Amdt. No. 3927, offered by the Senator from Pennsylvania (Mr. Specter) and the Senator from Rhode Island (Mr. Whitehouse); and Amdt. No. 3919, offered by the Senator from California (Mrs. Feinstein).

Ordered further, That the following amendments be subject to a majority vote threshold, with a motion to table any of these amendments in order:

Amdt. No. 3938. Amdt. No. 3907,

Amdt. No. 3927, Amdt. No. 3912, and

Amdt. No. 3979.

Ordered further, That the final amendments listed be subject to a 60 affirmative vote threshold, and that if an amendment does not achieve that threshold, the amendment be withdrawn:

Amdt. No. 3910, Amdt. No. 3919, and

Amdt. No. 3920.

Orderd further, That a managers' amendment be in order if cleared by the managers and the Leaders.

Ordered further, That upon disposition of all amendments, the substitute amendment, as amended, be agreed to, the bill be read a third time, and the Senate then vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the bill, notwithstanding rule XXII.

Ordered further, That if cloture is invoked on the bill, the Senator from Connecticut (Mr. Dodd) be recognized to speak for up to 4 hours and the Senator from Wisconsin (Mr. Feingold) for up to 15 minutes; provided further, that upon conclusion of those remarks, and the recognition of the managers for up to 10 minutes each, and the Senator from Vermont (Mr. Leahy) and the Senator from Pennsylvania (Mr. Specter) for 20 minutes each, the Senate proceed to vote on passage of the bill, as amended.

Ordered further, That upon passage of the bill, the Senate then proceed to Calendar No. 517, H.R. 3773, a bill to amend the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978 to establish a procedure for authorizing certain acquisitions of foreign intelligence, and

for other purposes; provided, that all after the enacting clause be stricken, and the text of S. 2248, as amended, be inserted in lieu thereof, the bill be advanced to third reading, passed and the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table; provided further, that passage of S. 2248 be vitiated and then returned to the Calendar.

Ordered further, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on S. 2248, the mandatory quorum required under rule XXII be waived. (Jan. 31, Feb. 5, 6, 7, 8, 11,

2008.)

## CONFERENCE REPORT TO ACCOMPANY H.R. 2082

2.—Ordered, That with respect to the conference report to accompany H.R. 2082, an act to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2008 for intelligence and intelligence-related activities of the United States Government, the Community Management Account, and the Central Intelligence Agency Retirement and Disability System, and for other purposes, the mandatory quorum under rule XXII be waived. (Feb. 11, 2008.)

### S. 1974

3.—Ordered, That upon passage of S. 1974, a bill to make technical corrections related to the Pension Protection Act of 2006, the bill remain at the desk until such time as

the Senate receives a companion measure from the House.

Ordered further, That when the Senate receives a companion measure from the House, the Senate then proceed to its consideration; provided, that all after the enacting clause be stricken and the text of S. 1974, as amended, be inserted, in lieu thereof; provided further, that the bill be read a third time, passed and the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table without further intervening action or debate, and that S. 1974 then be returned to the calendar. (Dec. 19, 2007.)

### S. 2483 (ORDER NO. 546)

4.—Ordered, That at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader, following consultation with the Republican Leader, the Senate proceed to the consideration of S. 2483, a bill to authorize certain programs and activities in the Forest Service, the Department of the Interior, and the Department of Energy, and for other purposes.

Ordered further, That it be considered under the following limitations: that the only amendments in order be five related amendments to be offered by the Senator from Oklahoma (Mr. Coburn), and that upon disposition of all amendments, the bill be read a third time, and the Senate proceed to vote in the passage of the bill. (Dec. 19, 2007.)

#### VETO MESSAGE ON S. 5

5.—Ordered, That the veto message on S. 5, the Stem Cell Research Enhancement Act of 2007, be considered as read and that it be printed in the Record and spread in full upon the Journal.

Ordered further, That the message be held at the desk. (June 20, 2007.)

#### H.R. 3997

6.—Ordered, That if the Senate receives from the House a message on H.R. 3997, an act to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide earnings assistance and tax relief to members of the uniformed services, volunteer firefighters, and Peace Corps volunteers, and for other purposes, with an amendment that is not germane to the Senate amendment or the underlying bill, that the bill and its amendments be referred to the Committee on Finance. (Dec. 12, 19, 2007.)
