Benzene, 2,4-diisocyanato-1-methyl-, homopolymer (CAS No. 26006-20-2) (provided for in subheading 3911.90.45).

### **Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:**

The subject product, Desmodur IL, is an aromatic polyisocyanate based on toluene diisocyanate (TDI) and dissolved in n-butyl acetate. This product is used in the coatings market with end use applications in furniture and metal coatings. The proponent claims that coatings based on this product lend themselves to applications that require high production rates and short dry-to-handle times.

Bayer MaterialScience imports this product from its affiliated company Bayer AG in Germany. There are no other known importers of this product.
