**Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:**

Trimethylopropane tris(3-aziridinylopropanoate), also known as XAMA 2, is a synthetic organic chemical component used as a crosslinker in the industrial finishing and adhesive industries. This chemical is used to improve strength and flexibility, solvent resistance, alcohol and water resistance, and increase the hardness of the final products in which it is incorporated. The proponent imports this product from Japan.

<sup>3</sup> The Commission may express an opinion on the HTS classification of a product to facilitate consideration of the bill. However, by law, only the U.S. Customs Service is authorized to issue a binding ruling on this matter. The Commission believes that the U.S. Customs Service should be consulted prior to enactment of the bill.

To suspend temporarily the duty on XAMA 2.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

### 3 **SECTION 1. XAMA 2.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of  
5 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is  
6 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following  
7 new heading:

8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
