The following upcoming events will take place at Trempealeau National Wildlife Refuge, managed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

Visitor Center/Refuge Office Hours: Open - Monday through Saturday, 7:30 am - 4:00 pm.

The center is now open Saturdays. Visitor Services park rangers will be in the office or roving to answer any questions. The center is closed Sundays and federal holidays including Independence Day and Labor Day. From the refuge entrance on West Prairie Rd., follow the paved road to the end.

Roving Rangers - Saturdays through August 23 from 1:00 pm - 4:00 pm. Enjoy guided hiking with Refuge park rangers on the nature trail located by the observation deck to look for birds, muskrats, and other interesting highlights. Obtain brochures and maps. Location: Stop at the Visitor Center/Refuge Office to contact a park ranger.

Volunteers on Deck – Weekends through September, volunteers are scheduled to be available on the observation deck. Volunteers will have bird books, and a variety of other identification books, as well as, brochures and maps to assist visitors. Stop in and chat with these very special refuge folks.

The guided hike will meet at the Prairie View Trail located along the Wildlife Drive. Meet at the Prairie View Trail parking lot at 10:00 am. This leisurely hike will last approximately

1 hour and will provide visitors with information about prairie wildflowers and some prairie legends. The walk is open to people of all ages and free of charge.

July 1 - Curious Canoeists! – Join park rangers for a 1½-hour canoe tour on the Refuge pools. Join us to see what we might discover on a gentle paddle in the Refuge. Meet at the boat ramp located just off the Wildlife Drive in the Refuge. The paddle will begin at 8:30 AM. Water, sunscreen, and insect repellent recommended.
