## STATEMENT OF SENATOR DANIEL K. INOUYE CHAIRMAN COMMITTEE ON INDIAN AFFAIRS BEFORE THE APRIL 30, 2002 JOINT HEARING ON S. 2335, A BILL TO ESTABLISH THE OFFICE OF NATIVE AMERICAN AFFAIRS, TO CREATE THE NATIVE AMERICAN SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

The Committee on Indian Affairs and the Committee on small business and entrepreneurship meet today to receive testimony on the challenges confronting the formation, development and growth of small businesses in Indian country.

The Committees will also receive testimony on s. 2335, a bill introduced by senators Johnson, Kerry, Cantwell, Wellstone, Daschle, Baucus, Bingaman, Stabenow, Clinton.

I am also pleased to serve as a co-sponsor of this measure.

S. 2335 provides statutory authority for the establishment of the

Office of Native American Affairs within the Small Business Administration, and further provides for the establishment of the Native American Small Business Development Program.

On behalf of both Committees, I must advise the witnesses for today's hearing that we have several Committees meeting at the same time today.

And so, to enable members who have to chair other hearings to do so, there will be several Senators chairing this hearing, and we will have to complete this hearing by 11:00 a.m.
