AMENDING SECTION 15-242, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING TITLE 15, CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE 2, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 15-242.01; RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona: 2 Section 1. Section 15-242, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 3 read: 4 15-242. Nutritional standards for elementary schools. middle 5 schools and junior high schools A. By July 1, 2006, The department shall develop minimum nutrition 6 7 standards that meet at least federal guidelines and regulations for foods and 8 beverages sold or served on the school grounds of elementary schools, middle 9 schools and junior high schools during the normal school day. These nutrition standards may include portion sizes, minimum nutrient values and a listing of 10 11 contents. This subsection does not prohibit the department from developing 12 minimum nutrition standards that are more stringent than the federal guidelines and regulations for foods and beverages sold or served on school 13 14 grounds during the normal school day. 15 B. All elementary schools, middle schools and junior high schools 16 shall participate in the national school lunch program as defined in Public 17 Law 108-265 except that a school district with fewer than one hundred pupils 18 that is not currently participating in the national school lunch program may 19 be exempt from this subsection if the school district governing board 20 determines at a public meeting to not participate in the requirements of this 21 subsection. 22 C. Food and beverages sold or served on the school grounds of 23 elementary schools, middle schools and junior high schools or at 24 school-sponsored events of elementary schools, middle schools and junior high 25 schools during the normal school day shall meet the nutrition standards 26 developed by the department, including foods and beverages offered as any of 27 the following: 28 1. A la carte items in the food service program. 29 Food and beverages sold in vending machines, snack bars and 2. 30 meal-period kiosks and at school stores. 31 D. Foods of minimal nutritional value as defined by 7 Code of Federal 32 Regulations section 210.11(2) shall not be served or sold during the normal 33 school day on any elementary school, middle school or junior high school 34 campus. 35 E. Beginning on July 15, 2006, New contracts and renewal contracts for food or beverages, or both, shall expressly prohibit the sale of sugared, 36 carbonated beverages and all other foods of minimal nutritional value as 37 38 defined by 7 Code of Federal Regulations section 210.11(2) on elementary 39 school, middle school and junior high school campuses. The department may 40 approve, on or after the effective date of this section AUGUST 12, 2005, a 41 carbonated drink that is determined by the department to meet or exceed the 42

F. Parents, pupils and community members may review food and beverage contracts to ensure that food and beverages sold on elementary school, middle school and junior high school campuses provide nutritious sustenance to pupils, promote good health, help students learn, provide energy and model fit living for life.

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G. School districts that offer instruction in grades nine through twelve may adopt nutrition standards for high school campuses.

8 H. School districts that offer instruction in grades nine through
 9 twelve may adopt nutrition standards for high school campuses.

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I. G. Nothing in this section shall be construed to:

Prohibit a school district from developing and adopting nutrition
 standards that are more stringent than those developed pursuant to this
 section.

Prohibit or limit the sale or distribution of any food or beverage
 item through fund-raising activities of students, teachers or educational
 groups when the items are intended for sale off the school grounds.

3. Prohibit or limit the sale or distribution of any food or beverage items to teachers, administrators or other adults in a faculty lounge or under other circumstances where the sale or distribution is limited to teachers, administrators or other adults.

21 Sec. 2. Title 15, chapter 2, article 2, Arizona Revised Statutes, is 22 amended by adding section 15-242.01, to read:

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15-242.01. <u>Nutrition standards for high schools</u>

24 A. BY JULY 1, 2008, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DEVELOP NUTRITION STANDARDS 25 FOR HIGH SCHOOLS THAT ARE SEPARATE FROM THE NUTRITION STANDARDS FOR ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS, MIDDLE SCHOOLS AND JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOLS DEVELOPED PURSUANT 26 27 TO SECTION 15-242. THE NUTRITIONAL STANDARDS FOR HIGH SCHOOLS SHALL MEET AT 28 LEAST FEDERAL GUIDELINES AND REGULATIONS FOR FOODS AND BEVERAGES SOLD ON 29 SCHOOL GROUNDS OF SCHOOLS THAT OFFER INSTRUCTION IN GRADES NINE THROUGH 30 TWELVE DURING THE NORMAL SCHOOL DAY. THESE NUTRITION STANDARDS MAY INCLUDE 31 PORTION SIZES APPROPRIATE FOR HIGH SCHOOL PUPILS, MINIMUM NUTRIENT VALUES AND 32 A LISTING OF CONTENTS. THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT PROHIBIT THE DEPARTMENT FROM 33 DEVELOPING MINIMUM NUTRITION STANDARDS THAT ARE MORE STRINGENT THAN THE FEDERAL GUIDELINES AND REGULATIONS FOR FOODS AND BEVERAGES SOLD OR SERVED ON 34 35 SCHOOL GROUNDS DURING THE NORMAL SCHOOL DAY.

B. CULINARY EDUCATION PROGRAMS ARE EXEMPT FROM THE NUTRITIONAL
 STANDARDS DEVELOPED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION UNLESS THE CULINARY EDUCATION
 PROGRAMS SELL FOOD OR BEVERAGES TO STUDENTS DURING THE NORMAL SCHOOL DAY.

C. FOOD AND BEVERAGES SOLD OR SERVED ON THE SCHOOL GROUNDS OF SCHOOLS
THAT OFFER INSTRUCTION IN GRADES NINE THROUGH TWELVE OR AT SCHOOL SPONSORED
EVENTS OF SCHOOLS THAT OFFER INSTRUCTION IN GRADES NINE THROUGH TWELVE DURING
THE NORMAL SCHOOL DAY SHALL MEET THE HIGH SCHOOL NUTRITION STANDARDS
DEVELOPED BY THE DEPARTMENT, INCLUDING FOODS AND BEVERAGES OFFERED AS ANY OF
THE FOLLOWING:

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1. A LA CARTE ITEMS IN THE FOOD SERVICE PROGRAM.

1 2. FOOD AND BEVERAGES SOLD IN VENDING MACHINES, SNACK BARS AND 2 MEAL-PERIOD KIOSKS AND AT SCHOOL STORES.

3 D. SCHOOLS THAT OFFER INSTRUCTION IN GRADES NINE THROUGH TWELVE SHALL PROVIDE A VARIETY OF BEVERAGE CHOICES TO HIGH SCHOOL PUPILS, SUCH AS BOTTLED 4 5 WATER, JUICE DRINKS THAT CONTAIN ONE HUNDRED PER CENT FRUIT OR VEGETABLE JUICE. ISOTONIC BEVERAGES AND LOW FAT MILK. NO MORE THAN FIFTY PER CENT OF 6 7 THE AVAILABLE BEVERAGES MAY INCLUDE DIET AND UNSWEETENED TEAS, ZERO CALORIE 8 CARBONATED DRINKS, SPORTS DRINKS OR JUICE DRINKS THAT CONTAIN LESS THAN FIFTY 9 PER CENT FRUIT OR VEGETABLE JUICE.

E. BEGINNING JULY 15, 2008, NEW CONTRACTS AND RENEWAL CONTRACTS FOR 10 11 FOOD OR BEVERAGES, OR BOTH, SHALL LIMIT THE SELECTION OF ALL DIET AND UNSWEETENED TEAS, ZERO CALORIE CARBONATED BEVERAGES, ISOTONIC DRINKS OR JUICE 12 13 DRINKS THAT CONTAIN LESS THAN FIFTY PER CENT FRUIT OR VEGETABLE JUICE TO NO MORE THAN FIFTY PER CENT OF VENDING MACHINE CAPACITY LOCATED ON THE CAMPUSES 14 15 OF SCHOOLS THAT OFFER INSTRUCTION IN GRADES NINE THROUGH TWELVE. ALL OTHER FOODS OF MINIMAL NUTRITIONAL VALUE SHALL BE EXPRESSLY PROHIBITED ON THE 16 17 CAMPUSES OF SCHOOLS THAT OFFER INSTRUCTION IN GRADES NINE THROUGH TWELVE 18 DURING THE NORMAL SCHOOL DAY.

19 F. PARENTS, PUPILS AND COMMUNITY MEMBERS MAY REVIEW FOOD AND BEVERAGE 20 CONTRACTS TO ENSURE THAT FOOD AND BEVERAGES SOLD ON THE CAMPUSES OF SCHOOLS 21 THAT OFFER INSTRUCTION IN GRADES NINE THROUGH TWELVE PROVIDE NUTRITIOUS 22 SUSTENANCE TO PUPILS, PROMOTE GOOD HEALTH, HELP STUDENTS LEARN, PROVIDE 23 ENERGY AND MODEL FIT LIVING FOR LIFE.

24 G. THIS SECTION SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE FINANCIAL AND COMPLIANCE 25 AUDITS PRESCRIBED IN SECTION 15-914. THE SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL MAKE AVAILABLE INTERNAL REPORTING THAT DEMONSTRATES ASSESSMENT OF COMPLIANCE WITH 26 27 THIS SECTION AND ANY CORRECTIVE ACTIONS REQUIRED FOR NONCOMPLIANCE. 28 NONCOMPLIANCE ACTIONS SHALL BE IDENTIFIED AS AUDIT FINDINGS AND SHALL BE 29 CONSISTENT WITH FORMAL CORRECTIVE ACTIONS OR PENALTIES, OR BOTH, OF THE 30 SINGLE AUDIT ACT AMENDMENTS OF 1996.

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H. THIS SECTION SHALL NOT BE CONSTRUED TO:

1. PROHIBIT A SCHOOL DISTRICT FROM DEVELOPING AND ADOPTING NUTRITION 32 33 STANDARDS THAT ARE MORE STRINGENT THAN THOSE DEVELOPED PURSUANT TO THIS 34 SECTION.

35 2. PROHIBIT OR LIMIT THE SALE OR DISTRIBUTION OF ANY FOOD OR BEVERAGE ITEM THROUGH FUND-RAISING ACTIVITIES OF STUDENTS, TEACHERS OR EDUCATIONAL 36 37 GROUPS IF THE ITEMS ARE INTENDED FOR SALE OR CONSUMPTION OFF THE SCHOOL 38 GROUNDS.

39 3. PROHIBIT OR LIMIT THE SALE OF OR DISTRIBUTION OF ANY FOOD OR 40 BEVERAGE ITEMS TO TEACHERS, ADMINISTRATORS OR OTHER ADULTS IN A FACULTY 41 LOUNGE OR UNDER OTHER CIRCUMSTANCES IF THE SALE OR DISTRIBUTION IS LIMITED TO 42 TEACHERS. ADMINISTRATORS OR OTHER ADULTS.
