

JOHN NEAL MULLICAN

Artist, Sculptor & Painter



A lifetime dedication to art and the love of nature form the foundation of his work. While his subjects may come from the broad spectrum of wildlife and the environment, his special love will always be the birds he knows so well.

Best known for his sculptures in bronze or wood that range in size from table top suited for home or office to large outdoor creations of bronze, stone, and water, that adorn the entries and courtyards of public and corporate buildings, of local and national parks.

Mullican's patrons include former President Reagan, the present and three past governors of Maryland, the governments of The United States of America, and The Republic of China; The State of Maryland, The Prince George's County Government, Prince George's Hospital Center, Greater Laurel Hospital, The Bowie Health Center, Montgomery Mutual Insurance Co., The Izaak Walton League of America, The Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission, The Maryland State Police, The Black-water National Wildlife Refuge, The Leigh, Yawkey, Woodson Art Museum, The Washington County Museum of Fine Arts, and many others.

His professional accomplishments include public, corporate, museum, and private bronze sculpture commissions. His work represented the United States at the 1992, World Exposition. It has been reproduced world wide by major corporations, such as Royal Doulton, Chilmark, Hudson Porcelain, and others, and featured at exhibitions throughout United States. Mullican sculpture is on display in museum collections in Washington DC, New York, Connecticut, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, and Maryland, and in the Capitals of Maryland, and The United States.

He was commissioned to design, create, and install The Prince George's County Police Memorial, and the entry display sculpture for the National Headquarters of the Izaak Walton League of America. Honors include The Maryland Governor's Citation, Ducks Unlimited Palette and Chisel Award, Distinguished Service Award, Conservation Award, and Maryland Artist of the Year. He has received over sixty national awards for his art. He was Featured Artist twice at The Easton Waterfowl Festival. Other major exhibitions include The National Audubon Society, The National Wildlife Federation, The Cape Code Museum, The Thousand Islands Museum, The Southeastern Wildlife Exhibition, The Florida Wildlife Exhibition, The National Wildlife Visitor's Center, and The Philadelphia Academy of Arts and Science.
