ORDER GRANTING BLANKET AUTHORIZATION TO IMPORT AND EXPORT NATURAL GAS FROM AND TO CANADA

DOE/FE ORDER NO. 2418

OCTOBER 18, 2007

I. DESCRIPTION OF REQUEST

On September 20, 2007, Enbridge Gas Services (US) Inc. (Enbridge) filed an application with the Office of Fossil Energy of the Department of Energy (DOE), under section 3 of the Natural Gas Act (NGA),¹ for blanket authorization to import and export up to a combined total of 400 billion cubic feet (Bcf) of natural gas from and to Canada. The applicant requests the authorization be granted for a two-year term beginning on November 1, 2007.² Enbridge Gas Services (US) Inc. is a Delaware corporation with its principal place of business in Houston, Texas.

II. FINDING

The application has been evaluated to determine if the proposed import and export arrangement meets the public interest requirement of section 3 of the NGA, as amended by section 201 of the Energy Policy Act of 1992 (Pub. L. 102-486). Under section 3(c), the import and export of natural gas, including liquefied natural gas (LNG), from and to a nation with which there is in effect a free trade agreement requiring national treatment for trade in natural gas and the import of LNG from other international sources are deemed to be consistent with the public interest and must be granted without modification or delay. The authorization sought by Enbridge to import and export natural gas from and to Canada, a nation with which a free trade agreement is in effect, meets the section 3(c) criterion and, therefore, is consistent with the public interest. This Order authorizes transactions with terms of no longer than two years.

ORDER

Pursuant to section 3 of the Natural Gas Act, it is ordered that:

A. Enbridge Gas Services (US) Inc. (Enbridge) is authorized to import and export up to a combined total of 400 billion cubic feet (Bcf) of natural gas from and to Canada pursuant to transactions that have terms of no longer than two years. This authorization shall be effective for a two-year term beginning on November 1, 2007, and extending through October 31, 2009.

B. This natural gas may be imported at any point on the border between the United States and Canada.

C. Monthly Reports: With respect to the natural gas imports and exports authorized by this Order, Enbridge shall file with the Office of Natural Gas Regulatory Activities, within 30 days following the last day of each calendar month, a report indicating whether imports or exports of natural gas have been made. Monthly reports must be filed whether or not initial deliveries have begun. If no imports and/or exports have been made, a report of "no activity" for that month must be filed. If imports and/or exports of natural gas have occurred, the report must give the following details: (1) for imports, country of origin; (2) for exports, the country of destination; (3) the point(s) of entry and exit; and (4) the total volume at each import or export point in thousand cubic feet (Mcf) for the month. D. The first monthly report required by this Order is due not later than December 30, 2007, and should cover the reporting period from November 1, 2007 through November 30, 2007.

E. Quarterly Reports: With respect to the natural gas imports and exports authorized by this Order, Enbridge shall file with the Office of Natural Gas Regulatory Activities, within 30 days following the last day of each calendar quarter, reports indicating

whether imports and/or exports of natural gas have been made. Quarterly reports must be filed whether or not initial deliveries have begun. If no imports and/or exports of natural gas have been made, a report of "no activity" for that calendar quarter must be filed. If imports or exports of natural gas have occurred, the report must give the details of each transaction, including: (1) the total monthly volumes in Mcf; (2) the average purchase price of gas per million British thermal units (MMBtu) at the international border; (3) the name of the supplier(s); (4) the name of the purchaser(s); (5) the estimated or actual duration of the supply agreement(s); (6) the name of the United States transporter(s); (7) the point(s) of entry or exit; and (8) for imports, the geographic market(s) served, by State.

- F. The first quarterly report required by this Order is due not later than January 30, 2008, and should cover the reporting period for the fourth calendar quarter, November 1, 2007 through December 31, 2007.
- G. Both the monthly and quarterly reports shall be filed with the U.S. Department of Energy, Office of Natural Gas Regulatory Activities, FE-34, P.O. Box 44375, Washington, D.C. 20026-4375.
