**AN ACT**

**AMENDING SECTION 41-1512, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO THE MILITARY AFFAIRS COMMISSION.**

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 41-1512, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to

4 41-1512. Military affairs commission; definition

5 ~~A. The military affairs commission is established. Through December~~  
6 ~~31, 2005, the commission membership consists of:~~

7 ~~1. Thirteen members who are appointed by the governor and who serve at~~  
8 ~~the pleasure of the governor.~~

9 ~~2. One member who is appointed by the president of the senate and who~~  
10 ~~serves at the pleasure of the president of the senate.~~

11 ~~3. One member who is appointed by the speaker of the house of~~  
12 ~~representatives and who serves at the pleasure of the speaker of the house of~~  
13 ~~representatives.~~

14 ~~B. A. From and after December 31, 2005,~~ The commission membership  
15 consists of the following members:

16 1. Three members who are appointed by the president of the senate, who  
17 serve at the pleasure of the president of the senate and who include the  
18 following:

19 (a) One member who is knowledgeable in military affairs and who  
20 represents the long-term interests of a military installation.

21 (b) One member who represents private property interests in the  
22 territory in the vicinity as defined in section 28-8461.

23 (c) One member who represents the interests of a city, town or county.

24 2. Three members who are appointed by the speaker of the house of  
25 representatives, who serve at the pleasure of the speaker of the house of  
26 representatives and who include the following:

27 (a) One member who is knowledgeable in military affairs and who  
28 represents the long-term interests of a military installation.

29 (b) One member who represents private property interests in the  
30 territory in the vicinity as defined in section 28-8461.

31 (c) One member who represents the interests of a city, town or county.

32 3. Nine members who are appointed by the governor, who serve at the  
33 pleasure of the governor and who include the following:

34 (a) Three members who are knowledgeable in military affairs and who  
35 represent the long-term interests of a military installation.

36 (b) Three members who represent private property interests in the  
37 territory in the vicinity as defined in section 28-8461.

38 (c) Three members who represent the interests of a city, town or  
39 county.

40 ~~C. B.~~ The military affairs commission shall have geographic diversity  
41 in its membership.

42 ~~D. C.~~ The commission shall:

43 1. Meet on a regular basis with the governor, the president of the  
44 senate and the speaker of the house of representatives to provide

1 recommendations on military issues and report on the progress of the military  
2 affairs commission.

3 2. Develop criteria, including accountability requirements, for  
4 awarding monies from the military installation fund established by section  
5 41-1512.01.

6 3. Review applications for monies to be awarded from the military  
7 installation fund.

8 4. Annually recommend to the department a priority listing of monies  
9 with available resources.

10 5. Recommend to the department how the monies in the military  
11 installation fund should be awarded.

12 ~~E.~~ D. For the purposes of this section, "military installation" means  
13 a military airport or ancillary military facility as defined in section  
14 28-8461 or any real property that services, supports or is used by the  
15 military.
