(E)-2-Butenoic acid (crotonic acid) is a synthetic organic chemical used as a preservative in cosmetics and personal care products. Clariant imports the product from Germany.

A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on Crotonic Acid.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. CROTONIC ACID.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.04.10 of the Har-
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended
6 by striking “12/31/2006” and inserting “12/31/2008”.

7 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
8 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
9 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
10 the date of enactment of this Act.
