**3 SECTION 1. ETHYL PYRUVATE.** 

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.01.48 of the Har5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
6 Ethyl pyruvate) is amended by striking "12/31/2006" and
7 inserting "12/31/2009".

8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
9 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
10 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
11 the date of the enactment of this Act.
