Ethyl pyruvate (CAS No. 617-35-6) (provided for in subheading 2918.30.90).

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

Ethyl pyruvate is a synthetic organic chemical used as an intermediate in the production of the fungicide famoxadone, which is used on cereals and vegetables. The product is imported from Japan and China.

A BILL

To extend the suspension of duty on Ethyl pyruvate.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. ETHYL PYRUVATE.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.01.48 of the Har-
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
6 Ethyl pyruvate) is amended by striking “12/31/2006” and
7 inserting “12/31/2009”.

8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
9 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
10 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
11 the date of the enactment of this Act.
