Through technical and educational processes, including field 23 investigations, public seminars, publications, conferences and mineral 24 displays. 25 2. By providing mining, metallurgical and other technical information 26 and assistance to all persons who are interested in developing the mineral 27 resources of this state. 28 C. Any claim or action against the department, the board of governors 29 or any member of the board or the director or DIVISION OR any other officer, 30 employee or volunteer of the department DIVISION in the person's official 31 capacity must be brought against the state of Arizona and not against the 32 department, board, board member, director or officer, ARIZONA GEOLOGICAL 33 SURVEY, THE DIVISION OR ANY employee or volunteer individually. Consistent with the objectives stated in section 27-101.01, the 36 37 department DIVISION shall: 38 1. Promote the development of the mineral resources and industry of 39 this state. 40 2. Advocate the development of mineral resources and the production of 41 minerals and mineral products in this state in support of its objectives. 42 Participate in conferences, seminars, forums, speaking engagements, 3. 43 public news media and other functions necessary to achieve its objectives.

1 4. Conduct studies of the properties and claims of companies and 2 individuals to assist in the exploration and development of mineral 3 resources.

5. Maintain a repository of mineral and mining information, including databases, books, periodicals, individual mine files, mine map repository files, mining district data and an archive of mine data. 2. The information is not and has not been reasonably obtainable by legitimate means by other persons without the person's consent, other than by governmental entities and other than in discovery based on a showing of special need in a judicial or quasi-judicial proceeding.

37 4. The person has satisfactorily shown that disclosing the information38 is likely to cause substantial harm to the person's competitive position.

This act is effective from and after December 31, 2008.
